~~Pair of Shoes, One Pair of Petticoats,~~  
*Two Suits, Two Pairs of Shirts, Two pair of Stockings,*  
*Two Handkerchiefs, Two Caps, one Pair of shoes,*  
*Two Petticoats*

I further acknowledge to have received from Major PALMER, Inspector-General of Prisons, the LORD LIEUTENANT'S Warrant, with a List of the Names of said *one hundred & thirtythree Female* Convicts, specifying the Crime, when tried, and Term of Transportation, and a Description of the Person of each, to be delivered by me to the Governor of NEW SOUTH WALES; which Warrant and List were put into a Tin Case, and sealed in my Presence.

*Twenty six Convicts accompanied the above Female Convicts supplied with two Suits of Clothing each*
