My dear Mr. McSwain:

Reference is made to your letter in which you request information in regard to James Pool, Sr., of Laurens District, South Carolina, soldier of the War of the Revolution.

The data furnished herein were obtained from the papers on file in pension claim, W. 9233, based upon the military service of James Pool, during the Revolution.

James Pool was born April 5, 1746 or 1756 (both dates are found in the claim) in Brunswick County, Virginia; the names of his parents are not given.

He enlisted, while residing in Mecklenburg County, Virginia, and served as a private with the Virginia troops, as follows— three months in Captain Anderson's company; three months in Captain Burton's company; and six months in Captain Thomas Williams' company, Colonel Stubblefield's regiment, in this tour, was in the battle of "Gates Defeat". No definite dates of enlistment given.

After the Revolution, he moved to Craven County, which was later Laurens District, South Carolina.

He was allowed pension on his application executed, October 15, 1832, at which time he was living in Laurens District, having lived there about forty-eight years, and was then referred to as James Pool,
