## Mrs. B. Dickerman Dies At Age 96

HAMDEN— Mrs. Ruby Russell Dickerman, 96, formerly of 45 Home Place, died Monday, Nov. 18, 1974, in Cheshire. She was the wife of the late Bennett J. Dickerman.

Born in Orange, Aug. 28, 1878, daughter of the late Elizer B. and Ann Maria Alling Russell, she had resided in Hamden since 1905 and taught school in Orange in the early 1900s. She was a member of the Mt. Carmel Congregational Church for many years and more recently was a member of the First Church of Christ Scientists.

Mrs. Dickerman's late husband was active in Hamden politics, serving as a state representative, town constable and chairman of the Hamden Town Planning Commission. He was also a member of the Republican Town Committee.

She leaves two daughters, Mrs. Raymond W. Andrews of Dallas, Tex., and Mrs. Harry T. Chamberlain Jr. of Cheshire; one son, Murlyn B. Dickerman of Alexandria, Va.; also four grandchildren and one great-grandchild.
