OBSERVED AND NOTED

When we were considering the names of the heads of families in Heidelberg township according to the census of 1790 we referred briefly to those of Ambrose and Michel Remaley. We stated at the time that the names should have been written Remaley or Remaley (there is no uniformity of spelling to this day.) I have delved further into the history of the Remaley (that is the style of spelling I shall follow) family. I find that Ambrose and Jacob Remaley were French Huguenots and came to this country in 1741 settling in that portion of Northampton county which now is Lehigh county. At the same time Coural Remaley settled in Philadelphia. Michell Remaley took out a warrant August 5, 1767, for thirty-two acres of land in what is now Washington township, but which at that time was in Heidelberg township. At Slatining and in the surrounding territory the Remaley have for 145 years been prominent. An Ambrose Remaley took up 232 acres of land situated south of what is now Slatining borough along the public road that follows the Lehigh river to Andreas saw-mill near Rockdale. He was a farmer. This Ambrose and the Michel Remaley were unquestionably

the same referred to in the list of the census enumerator.

Ambrose Remaley had two sons, John and Jacob. John was born May 23, 1788 and died July 12, 1853. He had the homestead farm. He married Salome Fenstermacher, who was born October 3, 1804, and died November 5, 1892, in her 89th year. Both are buried at the Friedens Church. They had two sons and two daughters: Elias, Daniel, Lucy, married to Daniel Zellner and Sarah married (first) to Elias Beat and (second) to Oliver Deshler.

Jacob Remaley the youngest son of Ambrose was born November 22, 1790, and died September 6, 1865. He was married to Catharine Remaley, who, it is said, was no near kin. She was born January 18, 1818 and died March 28, 1907, in her 90th year. Both are

buried at the Friedens church. The upper part of Slatining is built upon the acres once owned by Jacob Remaley and what is known as "Spruce Hill" was his property. They had nine children: Stephen, Charles, Jonas, David, Adam, Susanna, married to John Forward; Polly, married to Adam Kreitz; Lydia, married to Conrad Best; Carolina, married to Benjamin Rockel.

Of the children of Jacob, I have the history of only some of them. Charles the second son, lived on upper Main street, Slatining. He was born May 17, 1816, and died February 10, 1888. He was a carpenter and boat builder. He married Louisa Hamilton of Allentown and they had these children: Maria, married to Jonas Beidelman and they lived in Tiffin, Ohio; Elmina, married to W. K. Derr, late of
