Twenty Acres of Land whereon I now live During her Natural  
life and then it shall fall to my son Abraham Morgan to him  
and his Heirs and Assigns forever and I likewise give to  
my Wife During her Natural life all my moveable Estates  
and at her Death it is to be Divided Between her Children  
and I do hereby Nominate make and Ordain my wife Ester  
Morgan and my son Samuel Morgan my only and sole  
Exors: of this my last Will and Testament Revoking and  
making Void all other Wills and Testaments by me formerly  
made Declaring this and no other to be my last Will and  
I have hereunto set my hand and  
and fixt my seale this first day of April in the Year of our  
Lord God One Thousand Seven Hundred and Seventy fore
