BENJAMIN THACKER WILL

(Page 487)

9 Feb. 1818; April 1818

IN THE NAME OF GOD AMEN, I, Benjamin Thacker of Barren County calling to mind the certainty of death and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make Constitute and appoint this my Last Will and Testament revoking all other will or wills heretofore made and first I give my Body to the ground to be berried at the discretion of my Executors in a Christian like manner.

2nd: Impremis: I give unto my beloved wife Nancy all of my estate both raiel and personal after my just debts ar all paid dureing her natuel life and after her death then my will and desire is that my land shall go to my two sons: John & Benjamin Allso one horse and Cow to each of them if they can be spared and the balance of my property to my four youngest daughters namely: Delila, Senthey, Kenreto & Hanthaam Thacker. I give unto my sone Abel Thacker one horse and cow when he comes of age if it can be spared.

Allso I give to my sons: Allen Belcherson, Abner & Elizabeth Jinkens Two Dollars to Each of them when my wife can spare it either in money or property.

I give unto my son Turner a bond on James Duvall for Twenty three dollars together with the interest the said Twenty, Duvall in Bath + County Kentucky.

I hereby appoint my friend Simeon Lewis my Executor of this my last Will & Testament.....In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 9 day of February 1818.

There are no data as to soldier's family.

Nathaniel Thacker
S. 6236

Nathaniel Thacker was born March 2, 1764, in Fluvanna County, Virginia.

While residing in Fluvanna County, Virginia, he enlisted in 1779 or 1780, served two tours of three months each as a private under Captains Haden and James Adams, and guarded prisoners of Burgoyne's Army at Albemarle Barracks; he re-enlisted in 1780 or 1781, and served three months in Captain Daniel Tilghman's Company, Colonel Dabney's Virginia Regiment.

He was allowed pension on his application executed November 6, 1823, while residing in Albemarle County, Virginia.

There is no reference to wife or children.

In 1823, one Daniel Thacker made affidavit in Albemarle County, Virginia, in support of soldier's claim for pension; no relationship was shown.

Dear Madam:

Reference is made to your letter in which you request the records of Benjamin and Nathaniel Thacker, soldiers of the Revolutionary War, of Virginia.

You are furnished herein the histories of Benjamin and Nathaniel Thacker as contained in papers on file in their respective claims for pension, S.3789 and S.6236, based upon their military service in the Revolutionary War.

Benjamin Thacker
S.3789

The date and place of birth and the names of the parents of Benjamin Thacker (pensioned Thacker) are not shown in the papers in the pension claim.

While residing in Fluvanna County, Virginia, he enlisted in March 1778 or 1779, and served six months as a private in Captain Daniel Tillman's Company, Colonel Dabney's Virginia Regiment; he re-enlisted in 1779 or 1780, and served six months as a private in Captain Anthony Hasen's Company, Colonel Dabney's Virginia Regiment. He stated that he was in the battle of Jamestown where he was on what was called "the wagon guard".

After the Revolution, he resided in Fluvanna County, Virginia, until about 1824 or 1825, when he moved to the state of Tennessee.

He was allowed pension on his application executed October 24, 1832, at which time he was aged seventy-one or seventy-two years and resided in Roane County, Tennessee.

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
