## DEATH OF ABRAM ELLIOTT

Abraham Elliott was born near Chester, Illinois, March 5th, 1842, and died near Altoona, Kansas, November 18th, 1910, aged 68 years, 8 months and 24 days. He was married to Caroline Marlen August 26th, 1859. To this union were born six children, four faxx daughters and two sons, five of whom are living, viz: Mrs. Eva Wolever, of Fredonia, Kansas, Wm. Elliott of Pueblo, Colorado, Mrs. Minnie Frankenbury, of Altoona, and Herbert Elliott of Sycamore, Kansas and Mrs. Jessie Powell, of Altoona.

He came to Kansas in 1876, locating in Cowley County. From there he came to Wilson county in 1382, locating near Altoona, where he has since resided. His occupation has been that of a farmer. He was converted when a young man and between 35 and 40 years ago he united with the M. E. church, remaining a faithful member to the day of his death. He has not been in vigorous health for nearly four years but continued to do his work as best he could until last May when he had to cease entirely. He made a brave fight to live but all that skilled physicians and kind friends could do was unavailing. He was an affectionate husband, a kind father, a good citizen and a faithful Christian.

Mr. Elliott leaves a wife, four children, previously mentioned, and a host of friends to mourn his loss.

The funeral services were conducted by Rev. C. E. Creager, of the M. E. church, last Saturday at the home of the deceased and his remains were laid to rest in the Hatler cemetery.
