Susan Jane Hill, daughter of Jesse P. Hill & Francis (Rogers) Hill, b. 11/1/1837 in Tennessee. Died 2/27/1896 Scottsboro. Married 11/1/1854 Cherokee, Ala. to Col. Alexander Snodgrass.

Col. Alexander Snodgrass, b. 10/1/1820 in Abingdon, Washington Co., VA, d. 1/12/1897 at Scottsboro, Ala. His first marriage was to Lucetta Burd. They had one daughter Mary. She married Dandrell. Went to Houston, Texas. Susan Jane Hill was Col. Alexander Snodgrass's second wife.

Nov. 14<sup>th</sup>, 1871 ... The deceased lived in Gadsden, Ala.; she was sister of Mrs. A. Snodgrass, by whom and all of her family, she was most tenderly beloved, and the sudden and unexpected tidings of her death overwhelms our household with grief. We had, only three days ago, received letters from her dated 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> inst. of tenderness and affection, and expressing a hope that she would soon have the pleasure of visiting us. But such is life and the futility of Earthly hopes! We had no news of her sickness and have no particulars of her death. Her age was 31 years—she leaves a husband and three children, whose loss can never be supplied on Earth. Mrs. Golightly as a wife, mother, sister, and relation, as a neighbor and friend, was, in all respects, a superior woman—Her loss will be felt and mourned outside of her family circle. Words cannot express the grief of those who were bound to her by the ties of near relationship.

Just as we go to press, a letter received by Mrs. Snodgrass from Capt. A. L. Woodliff of Gadsden, from Chattanooga, Tenn. written yesterday, states that Mrs. G. died suddenly of congestion on Sunday evening at 4 o'clock—that Willie, her second daughter died at 12 o'clock on Tuesday, and that Mollie, her oldest daughter was lying very low with pneumonia.

John Snodgrass is a native and resident of Jackson. He was born in 1836, and is a nephew of Gen. Benj. Snodgrass, long a resident of the county, who died July 21, 1872. In May 1861 he entered the service of the Confederacy as captain of one of the first companies raised in the county. He served in Martin's 2d Confederate regiment under Gen. Sidney Johnston, and thus fought at Shiloh. A Battalion of six companies was then organized, with him as lieutenant colonel. He led this command at Baton Rouge and Corinth, and till February 1863. Norwood's battalion was then thrown with his, and the 55th Alabama organized, of which he became colonel. He shared the fortunes of that regiment and of the Western Army till the close, commanding Scott's brigade--the 12th Louisiana, 9th Arkansas, and 27th, 35th, 49th, 55th, and 57th Alabama regiments--from the battle of Franklin till Hood left Tennessee. He is now merchandising at Scottsboro, and that has been the business of his life.

Mrs. Sallie C. Davidson died at her home in Scottsboro, Ala., Feb. 19th, 1874. She was the daughter of Thos. and Caroline Snodgrass, was born September 29th, 1847. She professed religion and joined the C. P. Church in early life, but soon after joined the M. E. Church South, of which she remained an acceptable member during life. She was happily united in marriage to Mr. T. M. Davidson, January 19th, 1871. She was especially noted for a quiet, uniform, and consistent character. She was habitually pious, thus exhibiting the good effects of her early parental religious training. Her little infant girl (Maybel), although only about two years old, still remembers, and can point out the very spot where she has seen her "mama" pray. Only a few days after she saw her mother buried, while in the parlor with her grandmother, she stooped down and placing her little hand on the carpet near the center table, and looking up into her grandmother's face, she said, "Here where mama prayed." Oh! what a lesson to mothers. This circumstance teaches two important facts, first, that she did not neglect to take her little child with her to private devotion, and secondly, that the impressions of those sessions of prayer were not lost on that little mind, although it had been several months perhaps since she had seen her mother kneel there, as she has been too much afflicted to leave her room for sometimes past. She was one of those mothers who believe it is right to consecrate their children to God and the Church by baptism, and acted accordingly, and ever afterwards endeavored to impress those sacred lessons that the ordinance brings with it. Another specialty in her general character was that she was scrupulously conscientious in all matters of morality and religion, so much so that she could not tolerate anything that had the slightest appearance of deception. To know her one day was to know her the next also, for she was so eminently sincere that first acquaintance was always a true index to her character I might enlarge in just eulogies of the dead, for she was in most respects indeed a model for any community, but the unacceptability of lengthy obituary notices warns me to desist. We may truthfully say that the community has lost a most estimable and accomplished lady, the church an acceptable member, the mother a dutiful daughter, the brothers and sisters a very affection sister, the husband a devoted companion, but who sustains a greater loss among all those than the innocent unconscious prattling babe. May she live to adorn society by imitating her mother's virtues, for a life of modest piety admonishes us that our loss is her gain.

George B. Caldwell was born in Belfont, Jackson county, April 2, 1861, and is a son of Hamlin and Mary J. (Snodgrass) Caldwell. His early life was spent on his father's farm, and his education was acquired at the schools of Springfield, Ohio, and at the Lookout Mountain academy. From nineteen to twenty-five years of age he was in business in Louisiana, and there in April, 1875, married Miss Sarah E. Hair, daughter of J. B. and Ann (Brone) Hair, natives respectively of the states of Ohio and Tennessee. In 1876 he returned to his native county and resumed farming. He came to Scottsboro, merchandised a few months, was burned out, and is now, in addition to his farming, running a saw mill. The only official position that he appears to have held is that of justice of the peace, and he filled that office one term.

Hamlin Caldwell, father to the subject of this sketch, was born in New Hampshire in 1812. His parents moved to Portsmouth, Ohio, in 1814, and when twelve years of age he took up his abode in Cincinnati, making his home with a sister. For a while, when a young man, he was in mercantile business at Chillicothe, Ohio, and from there, in 1837, came to Alabama and located in Jackson county. At Belfonte, this county, he established a store, having brought a stock of goods with him from Ohio. He was among the first merchants, if not the very first, at Belfonte, and he continued there until 1850. For the then next succeeding thirty years he followed farming, and in 1880 moved into Scottsboro, where he has since made his home. He reared a family of six children. Mr. Caldwell is a self-made man. He started in the world poor, without even the advantages of schooling, but he rounds up a ripe old age with a handsome competency, and with the knowledge that in the accumulation thereof he has wronged no man. His father was Europe Caldwell, a native of New Hampshire, and his mother's maiden name was Hamlin, a relative of Hon. Hannibal Hamlin.

Jesse Edward Brown, son of Jeremiah and Mary Ann (Williams) Brown of Scottsboro, was born May 1, 1845, in Jackson County.

Jeremiah Brown is one of a family of North Carolinians who gave its name to Brownsboro. He was a planter in Jackson County and died here. He was a man of firm convictions and great stability of character. He was married three times.

His first wife was a Miss Moore, and by her he had two sons and one daughter: Bridges, who was a soldier and died at the battle of Corinth; John A., and Nancy, who married a Mr. Yates, of Birmingham. Mrs. Yates, a fluent speaker and writer, has edited various papers, at different times, both in this State and in Mississippi.

Jeremiah Brown was married a second time to Miss Mary Ann Williams, a daughter of a Samuel Williams, one of the pioneers of this county, who accumulated a goodly estate in land and slaves. She was one of a family of six children, and herself was the mother of four, viz.: Mary, wife of Col. John Snodgrass, of this place; Jesse Edward, of whom we now write; Margaret, wife of William H. Payne, druggist; Charles W., a lawyer, graduated at the University of Alabama, and now in the office of the superintendent of education.

Jesse E. Brown was educated at Georgetown, Ky., and Lebanon, Tenn., where he studied law. He was admitted to the bar in August, 1869, at Huntsville, and began his practice in Scottsboro, where he has remained up to the present writing. He represented his county in the State Legislature in 1872-3, and was one of the framers of the present Constitution of Alabama.

Mr. Brown became a member of the Confederate Army, in Frank Gurley's company, Fourth Alabama Cavalry, and served throughout the entire war. He was in battle near Farmington, wounded and captured at the second battle of Fort Donelson, and a prisoner at Louisville and Baltimore for about two months. He fought at Murfreesboro, Chickamauga, and Kennesaw Mountain, where he lost a leg, and was confined to the hospital for a long time thereafter. Having returned home, he studied law, as before mentioned.

Mr. Brown was married November 5, 1873, to Miss Virginia E. Wood, at Winchester, Tenn. She was a daughter of Ira G. wood, and they have three children, viz.: Zaida, Lawrence

Edward; Clifford, who was born in 1878 and died in 1880; and Jesse E.

Mr. Brown is a member of the Episcopal Church and of the fraternity of Odd Fellows. His position as one of the most prominent members of the bar in Northeastern Alabama is well known throughout that portion of the State, and his practice is extensive and lucrative.

Alexander Snodgrass, Postmaster, Scottsboro, son of James D. Snodgrass, was born in Washington County, Va., October 1, 1820.

James D. Snodgrass was born in the same place about 1790. He was a weaver by trade, as was his father before him, and he was also a farmer. He married Abigail Dunlap, of Scotch descent, and they had nine children.

Alexander Snodgrass was born in the ancestral home; educated at the common schools and Duffield Academy, Elizabeth, Tenn., and at Abingdon, Va. He came to Alabama in 1843; has been tax assessor, and was receiver of public money at the land offices at Lebanon and Centre for six years. He represented Cherokee County in the State Legislature two years, and was State agent for shipping salt for a year or two during the war. After the war, he established the Alabama Herald at Scottsboro.

In 1872 he was elected to represent Jackson, Marshall and DeKalb counties in the State Senate, and served there four years. He continued the publication of the Herald until January 16, 1887, when, on account of his appointment as postmaster by President Cleveland, the paper was discontinued.

In 1843, Mr. Snodgrass was married to Miss Lucetta Byrd, of this vicinity, by whom he had one daughter, Mary A., married to C. W. Daughdrill, and now living at Gadsden. In 1853 the first Mrs. Snodgrass died, and in December 1854, Mr. Snodgrass was married to Miss Susan Jane Hill, a lady related to a family of that name well known in Georgia and Tennessee. The children of this marriage are John Nathaniel, who died in infancy; Fannie V., now widow of F. R. King of New Orleans and for some time known as junior editoress of the Herald. She has become quite famous throughout the State as a writer under the nom de plume of "Rex" in the Birmingham Age; Susan Cornelia, wife of D. K. Caldwell, of this county, and living in Scottsboro; Jesse Alexander, wife of Dr. Beech, a dentist of Scottsboro; Irene and Minnie, yet at home.

Mr. Snodgrass is a member of the Episcopal Church and the Masonic fraternity.

The Fifty-fifth Alabama was made up of Snodgrass' and Norwood's battalions, which had already seen hard service, the former at Shiloh, Vicksburg, Baton Rouge and Corinth; the latter at Fort Donelson. The regiment was organized at Port Hudson, February, 1863, and fought at Baker's Creek, Jackson, and subsequent operations in Mississippi. It fought on the retreat

from Dalton and lost more than half its officers and men in [sic] killed and wounded at Peach Tree Creek. It was in winter campaign in Tennessee, suffering greatly at Franklin and Nashville, and returned to North Carolina, where it surrendered at Greensboro. Its colonel, John Snodgrass of Jackson county, led it throughout the war until the surrender.

vol. 2, page 226: In 1668, the Alabama Herald was established in Scotsboro, and in 1877, the Citizen. The editor and proprietor of the former was Hon. Alexander Snodgrass, who for many years represented Jackson county in the state senate. He was a vigorous writer and made the Herald a first-class weekly paper. His daughter, Miss Fannie Snodgrass, now Mrs. King, assisted him in the conduct of his paper. Her graceful style of writing soon made her popular with her contemporaries of the press and with the people at large. After her marriage she moved to Louisiana, but on the death of her husband, moved back to Alabama and still contributes to the press. The Herald, although ably edited, was discontinued after Mr. Snodgrass became postmaster at Scotsboro.

Tarpley M. Davidson, well-known merchant and banker of Warrior, Ala., was born in Walker county, Ga., in 1846. When he was only five years old, his parents moved to De Kalb county, Ala., and in the common schools of that county he received his education. He taught school in 1867 in Marshall county, Ala., and went into the drug business in Scotsboro, Ala., which he continued for two years. From 1871 to 1878 he was in the general merchandise business in the same place, but in the latter year he was appointed agent for the Memphis & Charleston railroad at Hillsboro, Ala., which place he held for seven years. In 1884 he had made valuable purchases of coal lands in and contiguous to Warrior, whither he removed in 1885, and opened an extensive mine, which he still operates. At the same time he opened a general store, which is also running. Upon the organization of the bank of Warrior in 1889 he was made president. Aside from his mining and mercantile interests, he has had a large plantation in Jackson county, Ala., and considerable landed estate in Jefferson and Lawrence counties, Ala. Mr. Davidson is a member of the Methodist Episcopal church. He was married in 1871 to Sallie, daughter of Col. Thomas Snodgrass, deceased, of Jackson county, Ala. There was only one child of this union, Mabel. He was again married in 1891, in Memphis, Tenn., to Miss Ida Austin, a daughter of M. S. Austin, of Mississippi. Mr. Davidson's father was Rev. A B. Davidson, a native of Virginia, who came to Georgia about 1838. His wife was Lucinda Harben, of South Carolina. They had eight children. The following five are living: Dr. A. S. Davidson, of Blount county, Ala.; J. W. Davidson, of Blount county; T. M. Davidson; Henry M. Davidson, of Morgan county, Ala., and S. C. Davidson, of Warrior, Ala. The father of Mr. Davidson died in 1885, and the mother in 1874.

John Snodgrass, merchant, colonel, C. S. Army, was born May 19, 1836, in Jackson County, and died August 19, 1888, at Scottsboro; son of Thomas and Caroline (Martin) Snodgrass, the former, who was a native of Jackson County; grandson of John and Jane (Long) Snodgrass, who lived at Bellefonte, and of John and Ruth (Burns) Martin, who lived at Bellefont; great-grandson of Col. William Snodgrass of Tennessee who was a veteran of the Revolutionary war, of John Burns, of South Carolina, who served in the American Army, 1777-79, and of Captain John Martin, who was a veteran of the Revolutionary War; great-great-grandson of Abraham and Elizabeth (Marshall) Martin, the latter who delivered dispatches to Gen. Greene which her daughter had taken from a courier; and nephew of Gen. Benjamin Snodgrass, at one time a resident of Jackson County. His early education was received under the instruction of his cousin, Alex Snodgrass, and he was then sent to Huntsville to finish his education. He was a merchant at Bellefonte when the War of Secession broke out, and he enlisted, in May, 1861, in the C. S. Army, as captain of one of the first companies raised in the county. He served in Martin's Second Confederate regiment under Gen. Albert Sidney Johnston, and with this regiment fought at Shiloh. He was then made lieutenant-colonel of a battalion of six companies, which was called Snodgrass's battalion, and he led this command at Baton Rouge, Corinth, and until February, 1863, when Norwood's battalion was thrown with his, and the Fifty-fifth Alabama regiment organized, of which he became colonel. He served with that regiment and the western army, until the close of the war, commanding Scott's brigade, consisting of the Twelfth Louisiana, the Ninth Arkansas, and the Twenty-seventh, Thirty-fifth, Forty-ninth, Fifty-fifth, and Fifty-seventh Alabama regiments, from the battle of Franklin until Hood left Tennessee. After the war, he returned home and engaged in the mercantile business which business he continued in until his death. He was a Democrat, and often served as chairman of the executive committee, and was a delegate to the national convention that named Grover Cleveland presidential candidate. He was a member of the Episcopal church, and served as senior warden and lay reader of St. Luke's church, at Scottsboro, and was an Odd Fellow and Knight of Honor. Married: in 1861, in Jackson County to a Miss <Mary J.> Brown, daughter of Jeremiah and Mary (Williams) Brown who lived in Jackson County; granddaughter of Samuel and Margaret (Gwynne) Williams, the latter who was of the Virginia line, who owned Gwynne's Island, and who trace their ancestry to a common ancestor of the King of England; great-granddaughter of Samuel and Mary M. Harry M. Henderson, Sr., age 80, passed away at his home in Scottsboro about midnight, Tuesday, January 16, 1940. The funeral was held at the Scottsboro Methodist Church, of which he was a member, Thursday morning at 10:30 and interment was in Cedar Hill cemetery, where he was laid to rest beside his departed mother, sister, and other kin. The funeral service was conducted by the pastor, Rev. J.A. Bentley, and internment was in charge of Scottsboro Funeral Home.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Sally [Sallie] Snodgrass Henderson, two daughters, Mrs. Elizabeth Keefer and Miss Margaret Henderson, of Washington D.C., and one son, Harry Moore Henderson, Jr., and one grandson, Billy Henderson, of Portales, New Mexico.

Harry Henderson was actively identified with the history of Scottsboro for nearly sixty years. His father was a Methodist minister stationed here when he was a youth. His sister married the young editor and publisher of the Scottsboro Citizen, James Armstrong, and after the death of his father more than fifty years ago, Mr. Henderson and his mother came to Scottsboro to make their home, and he was associated for many years with Mr. Armstrong in the newspaper and printing business in this city.

He was a man of unusual literary ability and one of the finest types of Southern gentleman, always courteous and sympathetic and even in his last years of affliction and dotage, he continued to be cheerful and hearty with everyone. With the exception of a short residence in Florida, he spent most of his adult life in this city and community, engaging in the newspaper business and farming. He formerly published his own newspapers in this city and up until his physical impairment by deafness and failing vision a few years ago, he was associated with the local newspaper offices. He also served as Mayor of Scottsboro one time.

Having been an in-law relative of the present editor of these newspapers, Uncle Harry was our most intimate and helpful friend through many, many years. It was he who first taught us the type cases and how to fix up a form for printing on the old job press. It was our privilege and pleasure to be employed by him in his business and later to return this favor of giving him a place in our own business so we feel we are able to truthfully say he was a fine and good man, a man with tender mercy for all and whose high sense of honor was never dimmed by adversity, need or circumstances.

When it now becomes our sad duty this day to write a newspaper eulogy to his life and passing, we are vividly recalling the hundreds of beautiful tributes and eulogies he had penned himself in the dim past to departed friends and citizens. Even after he had to retire from the local newspaper offices, he did not lose his love of the place of his best loved work and was a visitor to us every time he came to town. Up until a few weeks ago his physical ability was remarkable for a man of his advanced age and he would have been classed twenty years younger than his age by those who did not know.

In his passing we lose a very dear friend, who loved us, we believe, next to his own immediate family, and we will miss him very much and be glad for his life the way we knew it.

It has been the philosophy of this editor that all humans must at some time walk up to the gates at the end of the road, turn the handles and walk inside into a mist from whence no one has returned. And it is the tracks they leave behind, or the flowers that they have planted along this road that grow up and continue to bloom season after season, which determine how long we will remember the sower who passed that way. Some pass into the gates and leave straggly flowers and are soon forgotten, while others leave monuments, not of stone and marble, but of lovely flowers of friendship of bright sunny days of companionship and heavily fruited orchards of charity and human understanding. Uncle Harry leaves the latter kind in memory lane as he walks into the mist.

[Jane Nichols: is the Snodgrass Cemetery, the land it is on is rented by a hunting club and was posted no trespassing and we had to walk forever to find it. I was told by a man that belongs to the hunting club it was there. There is a handwritten book at our library written in 1959 that I found a listing of the cemetery. When I go back to the library I will see who the other Snodgrass' are that are buried there. That is where I found out it was called the Snodgrass Cemetery. At one time the Snodgrass' owned all the land where all these cemeteries are. Which is alot of land. I will keep my eye out for other Snodgrass' when I am in some of these other cemeteries and will let you know who they are. We go to cemeteries in corn fields, soybean fields and cow pastures that are long forgotten. Some of them we can't get to until the crops are in and the snakes have sought other resting places for the winter.

\* Sarah Long Snodgrass was born and raised in Jackson County located in the northeastern corner of Alabama. She was one of several young sisters in the family. Each of her older brothers was responsible for one of his younger sisters as her escort at community socials and other events. Sarah married Thomas Robert Mattox, who arrived with a friend from Xenia, Greene County, Ohio. His friend married one of Sarah's sisters. Thomas and his friend opened a general store in the township of Bellefonte. Sarah and Thomas's first child, a daughter, died at age seven. Four other children, a son and three daughters reached adulthood. Thomas died in Nov of 1861, about the time war clouds were gathering for the Civil War. In this part of Alabama, feelings ran high for both the North and South. His friend took his wife, Sarah's sister, and family north to Ohio for the duration of the war. In all the unrest, assets of Thomas' estate and all records seemed to disappear. There was a rumor that his ledgers were thrown in the Tennessee River. Sarah was left struggling to provide for her children. Her son remembered that he was so small his mother had to lift the plow handles so he could get under them to plow. Sarah was known for her natural nursing ability and was often called to care for the sick. One evening, she returned from a call in the rain, became sick and died. Her orphaned children were separated and sent to live with different relatives. John was not treated well by his older cousins and the uncle where he stayed. Sarah's older daughter, Catherine, married and moved to Texas. John soon followed on foot, with a sack of fine cut tobacco over his shoulder to trade for food. He found a place to sharecrop. With his share from the sale of the crop, he sent for his other sisters, Carrie and Willie. Sarah's orphaned children raised families of their own in Texas, but always remained close. John had artist drawn portraits of his parents and himself as a small boy, hanging at the head of his bed. He always paused to gaze at them before retiring at night. These adult children in faraway Texas, always spoke of this mother, Sarah, with great love and affection.

Regan Bradshaw died Sunday, October 10, 1998. Regan was born May 4, 1943, in Texarkana, Texas, to Evalyn and Barney A. Bradshaw. He grew up in Lufkin "in an all Lufkin family." He built his first darkroom in the family garage in seventh grade and was photographer for the high school annual. He graduated from Lufkin High School in 1961. In the summer of 1963, he was a cub reporter for the Lufkin News, carrying his camera, for they had no staff photographers. He was a UT Plan II graduate in 1965, and began graduate school in government, but opted instead for the Germain School of Photography in New York.

Regan was an industrial photographer for Tracor in 1967-68 and a photographer and photo editor for *Texas Parks and Wildlife* magazine from 1968-71. He had been an independent commercial photographer since then with many regional and national clients.

He was an advocate for other photographers as the founding president of the Austin/San Antonio chapter of the American Society of Media Photographers in 1985. He had served on the Board of Directors of the National A.S.M.P. since 1987, holding offices culminating with the presidency from 1995-97. He was most noted for his efforts in copyright protection,

education, and for his authorship of the A.S.M.P. code of ethics. He was the authority on business knowledge for Central Texas photographers.

Reagan photographed in depth the natural world of Texas and was well known for his and Griffin Smith Jr.'s 1983 book, "Forgotten Texas."

He is survived by his wife, Elizabeth Shepperd Bradshaw; mother, Evalyn Bradshaw; sister, Emily Kirkman; brother, Stephen Bradshaw; children, Katy Bradshaw, Patrick Bradshaw, Joaquin Morin, Silke Morin and her husband, Michael Martin; and grandchildren, Jasper Morin Martin and Calvin Morin Martin; and a large family of friends. He was preceded in death by his father, Barney Bradshaw, in 1966.

Reagan was a photographer, pilot, guitarist, canoeist, kayaker, skier, scuba diver, husband, father, and grandfather. He was a quiet, but large presence in many of our lives, and will be remembered always.

Prior to the American Civil War John Snodgrass was a merchant in Bellefonte and served as Jackson County Sheriff from 1849-1852. When war broke out in 1861 he enlisted as the Captain of Company B, 2nd Confederate Infantry Regiment. He was wounded at Shiloh and served as a Captain until the unit was disbanded in May 1862. He then became a Lieutenant Colonel of a battalion which was to be called Snodgrass's Battalion and served until his unit was merged with Norwood's Battalion and redesignated the 55th Alabama Volunteer Infantry Regiment in 1863. His new regiment served at the Dalton, Peachtree Creek, Franklin, and Nashville. The regiment was finally surrendered under Col. Snodgrass at Greensboro, North Carolina. After the war, he opened a general mercantile store and served as the Memphis and Charleston Railroad depot agent during the late 1860's. He helped organize St. Luke's Episcopal Church in Scottsboro. He was also one of the first in Jackson County to install a

home telephone, and the event was considered newsworthy, as the editor of The Alabama Herald reported that Col. John Snodgrass "can now talk between his store and his home".

page 51: The 55th Alabama Infantry was organized at Port Hudson, Louisiana, in Feb 1863, by consolidating the six companies of Snodgrass's 16th Alabama Battalion with the five companies of Norwood's 6th Battalion. The regiment elected John Snodgrass of Jackson Co. commander and chose John H. Norwood of the same county as second in command.

page 52: The 55th surrendered at Greensboro, North Carolina, in Apr 1865, with Colonel Snodgrass still in command.

page 108: Colonel John Snodgrass of Jackson Co. commanded troops in the 2nd Confederate Infantry and the 55th Alabama Regt. after consolidation. Wounded in the Battle of Shiloh, he was elected Lieutenant Colonel, in May 1862. After Shiloh, he led an independent command of six companies, known in the field as Snodgrass' Battalion, at Baton Rouge and Corinth. In Feb 1863 he advanced to the rank of Colonel. His command was joined with Lieutenant Colonel John Norwood's Battalion, commanded by another Jackson Co. officer, to form the 55th Alabama Infantry with Snodgrass in command. He held this position until his Parole at Nashville, in May 1865.

My Dear Mr. Percival,

I was born and reared in Scottsboro, Alabama. My father was a dentist there, Dr. Chas. Quintard Beech. My mother was Alexandria Snodgrass Beech, one of five sisters, daughters of Susan Jane Hill Snodgrass and Alexander Snodgrass. Alexander Snodgrass was born in Washington Co., Virginia, Abingdon.

He came to Alabama to teach his double cousins, children and grandchildren of John Snodgrass and Jane Long. John's family had settled in Dekalb Co., Alabama. Grandfather became a land agent. Then he was a representative or a Confederate Senator from Cherokee to the Second Call of the Confederate Senate. The First Call was Jan 1861; the second was in Mar 1861. This I obtained from Owens History of Alabama. After the War, he represented Cherokee and Jackson Cos. and Madison Co. (also from Owens History of AL). He moved from

Belfont, Dekalb Co., to Jackson Co., Scottsboro, about 1866.

My mother was born 18 Jun 1864 in Belfont, Cherokee Co., on a plantation. When slaves were set free, grandfather sold his land for a little or nothing. He then owned and edited The Alabama Herald, one of the first newspapers published in Northern Alabama. During the war he was a Major or an Agent. Alabama has his name once as Major and once as Agent. He went with his cousin Col. John Snodgrass and was in the Quartermasters Dept. He bought food for cousin John's Co. I have letters from him to grandmother telling of battles. He was about 40 years old then.

Now I believe he did not write any more of himself because in his old age he was appointed Postmaster by President Grover Cleveland and did not want any more trouble with Yankees and Carpet Baggers. I was writing some of this from memory and remember I am wrong. His father-in-law was Judge Jesse Pleasant Hill of Cherokee Co. He represented Dekalb Co., and mama was born in Dekalb Co. I will inclose a typed copy I have from the Archives of History; please copy.

I will go through my letters and papers and select what I have, but have very little proof. There are three or four women who have gone in the D.A.R. on William of Sullivan Co., Tennessee. And they claimed about all the military records they could find, but they went in many years ago, before they had to have proof. In the D.A.R. papers of James Snodgrass descendants, it states he fought at Kings Mountain under Campbell with his brother William.

William was not a poor man, so did not ask for a pension. He was trustee of a school in Abingdon, Virginia. That building is now a hotel. My Sister, Mrs. Garren, when driving through Abingdon, Virginia, stopped and went to the courthouse and found the marriage record of the license of William Snodgrass and Sarah Long, 22 Aug 1786. These records were copied by the WPA and are alphabetical now.

But they left off witnesses and surety bonds, which was a grave mistake as the mothers, fathers, or some relative were witnesses and now are difficult to find.

Now the Snodgrass brothers located in Botetourt Co., Virginia, which later about 1778 was divided, and Washington Co. was formed from part of it, and so the brothers then lived in different counties, as Augusta was also formed. Later Allegheny Co. was taken from Botetourt. That is the reason it is difficult to find.

Alexander Dunlap, I believe, is the father of my Abigail, great-grandmother. His farm, "Goochen," was in Botetourt; later was in Allegheny. He was one of the first judges of Allegheny.

In 1936, my youngest brother lived in Portland, Oregon. He was unmarried, was 24 years old. He lived in a family hotel and told me he met a Mrs. Snodgrass who had a family Bible that carried the family back to Scotland and probably Wales, and before that he was not interested and did not know I was, so did not copy anything. I wrote and got a telephone book and wrote many people of the Snodgrass name, but none answered. Some one has that Bible, but I finally stopped writing and went in the DAR on my Hill line.

Dear Miss Hawthorne,

Tradition is: Three brothers, David, Joseph, & John Snodgrass came from Ireland. They first migrated from Scotland to Ireland. A generation or two earlier? Came from Ireland to Virginia. John belonged to the House of Burgesses and fought in the French and Indian Wars. He voted for George Washington; I have the book and page [number].

John (Augusta) received land grant, had sons William, James, John, and Alexander on lamghter[?]. Polly married a Stewart. William married in Abingdon, Virginia, Sarah Long; marriage is recorded by WPA. He had oldest child, William, born Jun 1788, married Orphia Smith in Washington Co., Tennessee. I also have dates. They had twelve children; I have their names and dates. Now I think the second son of William and Sarah Long was my ancestor. Grandfather wrote, and it was printed in autobiographies in North Alabama. He was Alexander Snodgrass. The ancestral home was in Washington Co., Virginia, as was my [i.e. Alexander's] father, James H. Snodgrass. He said he went to McGuffies academy in Abingdon. His mother was Abigail Dunlop. I only know his oldest brother, William, was killed in the War Between the States. He had two other brothers killed about the same time. I do not know their names. There were nine children. I knew Margaret the youngest child. She married John Morgan about 1858 and lived at Langston, Alabama.

Draper speaks of William as "Colonel William" of Tennessee. He went to Washington Co., Tennessee. He was trustee of a college or academy at Abingdon. Now I cannot find his military record, for another woman has claimed all military records for another William Snodgrass, the one that was killed in the Revolution.

James, son of John, married Ann Long, went to Sparta, White Co., Tennessee. I have all his children and loads of his grandchildren. He is established in DAR and their papers begin with John having four sons: James, John, William, and Alex. John married Jane Long, sister of Ann Long. He moved to Alabama.

Grandfather came to Alabama in 1843 to teach his cousins. He did not name his brothers and sisters, but did tell my mother that her grandmother was Sarah Long. Then I have a copy of what he wrote in North Alabama Biographies. He was a senator in the second Call of the Confederacy, that was in March; the first was in January. (Owens History of

Alabama) He was in the Alabama Legislature.

I am a widow and a registered nurse.

I have proof John Snodgrass had sons (1) William, married Sarah Long; (2) James, m. Ann Long & went to White Co., Tennessee; (3) John m. Jane Long, have list of children of these two; (4) Alexander, I don't know who he married, a daughter Polley m. \_\_\_ Stewart and probably others.

Are you a Daughter of the American Revolution, and if so on whose service:  
[yes], Isaac Hill.

What is your National Number? 340,493.

Isaac Hill fought from Maryland, lived in Halifax Co., NC, in the 1790 census. I have all the Hill (Isaac) children & who they married, but would like my Hills from the first immigrants: John and his son Henry (will 1710): Isaac, John, Henry, then my Isaac. This I have no proof from my Revolutionary Isaac, but that is the way it is.

John Snodgrass (Do you know he was the immigrant? There was a William as old or older?) But tradition says: Three brothers came from Scotland first Wales--then Scotland then Ireland to U.S. John David, & Joseph. They all, I believe, named sons William.

The Lady to which you refer descended, I believe, from one Wm. and they claim all military records I could find. James's descendants belong to the D.A.R. and state in their papers John had sons as I previously stated and Wm. & James fought at Kings Mountain but I believe I would have to disprove a portion [of] this other woman's D.A.R. Military record. William's and Sarah Long's marriage record is in the courthouse in Abingdon, VA.

Wm. & Sarah had son William who m. Ophea Smith in Wash. Co., Tennessee. I have dates of marriage & m. record. Also a long list, I believe 12 children. Wm. was born in Jun 1788. I think my James D. was the 2nd child of Wm. My grandfather wrote & it was published in a large book: Autobiographies of North Alabama (he came to North Alabama in 1843). That he was born in (I have all these dates should you want them) 1820 in the ancestral home in Washington Co. "As was my father James D. Snodgrass" and that his mother was Abigail Dunlap of Scotch descent. William Snodgrass was a trustee of a college in Abingdon, VA. A positive descendant of his son & Ophia S. wrote me that when Wash. Co. was divided he was in TN and was the clerk of court for 20 years. Draper writes of him as Col. William of Tenn. and Kings Mt. There were several military records but the woman, a Mrs. Lyons, claimed them all.

There was one Wm. killed, another [Wm.] that after his death his wife asked for a pension but could prove no military record except War of 1812. She was a second wife, Margaret. The Wm. Mrs. Lyons claims was supposed to have a Rev. marker at his grave, but they put it at another Wm.'s

Now I have never found Wm's will and cannot prove James D. was his son, but James D.'s father owned the home his father was born in. Grandfather had 8 brothers and sisters, but I only knew the names of Wm. who was killed in the War between the States & he had children. Grandfather took 2 girls, one Eliza married John Robinson, he was John McClung adopted by the Robinsons, one son John died no children Hugh Robinson took back the name McClung, lives in Wash., DC, two girls married.

Grandfather had a sister Margaret, married G.father's overseer on the plantation in Alabama. He disowned her. She married John Morgan, had 9 children, lived in Langston, Alabama. James D. must have died before 1858 as Margaret was living with Grandfather, and his mother lived with him in Alabama during the Civil War. I have heard it was word of 3 sons being killed came to her at once. James D. may have moved to Elizabeth, Tennessee, as grandfather said he went to school there and in Abingdon, Virginia. I have the date of Wm. & Sarah Long's marriage somewhere if you want it. It was about 1787. If you want these dates, I will look them up. I would love to have what you have on the Snodgrass family. I want who, where, and when. I have a letter from a Snodgrass written several years ago to a cousin who descended from John Snodgrass & Jane Long, and he said he found the graves of Wm. & Sarah [in] some little town in TN, but they were unmarked. I would like to get this to pass on to my son as well as my sister's five and brother's two children.

P.S. My elder sister found a letter to grandfather from I believe a Hawthorn, and in it a son

Henry who was in college was mentioned. This I believe was in Bristol, Tennessee or Virginia. So she wrote to Henry or his descendant and some lady answered for Henry's daughter, an old blind lady this Margret I think she decided was James D. Snodgrass's sister and as he had a daughter Margaret it probably was.

Dear Mrs. Hurston:

I am greatly in your debt for the questionnaire and notes you sent me pertaining to your Snodgrass ancestry. I have made a copy of that part of that portion which deals exclusively with your early ancestry. I wish to say to you:

1st: I find nothing in your notes to indicate any relationship with the Margaret Snodgrass who married Samuel Hawthorn in Washington Co., Virginia. My conclusions to date are that the father of this lady was a David Snodgrass who also died in Washington Co., Virginia.

2nd: Your attention is called particularly to the data mentioned in the enclosed memorandum, from Mayor James David Snodgrass of Scottsboro, Alabama, who appears certainly to have been a near relative of yours. He spoke with such detail, and lived at a time and place where he should have known this family quite well. Note that he said his grandfather was J. D. Snodgrass, wife Jane Long, niece of his Uncle James Snodgrass's wife. This would indicate that James and John Snodgrass were not brothers.

3rd: Your ancestor quite evidently was the man known as Col. William Snodgrass, who fought at King's Mountain. J. D. Snodgrass did not name his (Col. William's) wife. There was an indication he may have been twice married. I wonder where you got the data that William married Sarah Long. Let me here retract this: My copy of marriages in Washington Co., Virginia, show marriage of William Snodgrass to Sarah Long, 22 Aug 1786. And strange to relate, it shows John Snodgrass married Jean Long or Lowry, 25 Jun 1799. It seems a bit strange that Mayor Snodgrass did not mention his ancestress and show how she was related if at all to James Snodgrass's wife of Virginia.

4th: I think I am on the trail of the true relationships of these various families, and I would be tremendously glad if you could lend me those old letters and family sketches you mentioned, long enough to enable me to review them in the light of records I have before me. I pledge you to return them within a few days, if you will trust me with them. With that data, I may be able to untangle some of the discrepancies mentioned.

[Mr. Cole's typed copy of the information from Mrs. Hurston, see above (pages 279-283); followed by his comments below:]

Note 1: It appears from the data submitted that Mrs. Hurston was in doubt as to whether her great-great-grandfather was William, who had wife Sarah Long.

Note 2: Unless I misread Mrs. Hurston's notes, she listed as children of John Snodgrass, four sons (as indicated above) William, James, and John, and she said the three married ladies named Long. This is highly important, if it can be proven. In past years, I have had correspondence with two persons of the Snodgrass family, who graciously loaned me their data. One was Mayor J. D. Snodgrass of Scottsboro, Alabama, the other Mrs. Bertha C.

Marshan of Sherman, Texas. She gave me the Bible record of this family, showing Major James (son of John) born 31 Oct 1762; d. 3 Jul 1828 in Virginia; m. 30 Oct 1781 in Washington Co., Virginia, Ann Long, who was b. 23 May 1766. The children with birth dates shown were:

1. Rebecca, b. 22 Dec 1782.
2. Margaret, b. 10 Sep 1784; m. \_\_\_ Lyons.
3. Martha, b. 4 Oct 1786; m. \_\_\_ Glenn (great-grandmother of Mrs. Marshan).
4. Sallie, b. 20 Sep 1788.
5. David, b. 26 Apr 1792 (grandfather of Mrs. Marshan's first husband).
6. William, b. 4 Oct 1792.
8. Polly, b. 15 Apr 1795.
9. James, b. 25 Dec 1798.

The record of the children of James Snodgrass and wife Ann Long stated that Joseph Snodgrass married Ann Edmondson, which is one of the families to which Redmond S. Cole belongs. It then recited that of the children of the Revolutionary soldier James Snodgrass, David, James, William, Thomas, Martha, and Elizabeth all moved to White Co., Tennessee, where many of their descendants yet live. (The manuscript was undated.)

[Note 4:] Turning now to the family sketch supplied by Mr. J. D. Snodgrass of Scottsboro, Alabama, this man (now deceased) said his name was: James David Snodgrass, b. at Bellfonte, Jackson Co., AL, 1859; son of John Snodgrass, b. 1808 at Abingdon, Washington Co., Virginia, who died in Alabama; grandson of John Snodgrass of Washington Co., Virginia; and great-grandson of Colonel William Snodgrass, who lived in Washington Co., Virginia, and who received for his services in the army large grants of land in Tennessee, upon which he lived.

At another place in his notes to me, he [John David Snodgrass] said his father was John Snodgrass, wife Louisa Byrd; his grandfather was J. D. Snodgrass, wife Jane Long; and his great-grandfather was Col. William Snodgrass of Virginia & Tennessee.

Quoting directly from his manuscript, J. D. Snodgrass of Scottsboro then said, "Col. William Snodgrass, like most of this family, had a number of children. The one who came to Alabama in 1812 was John, whose wife was Jane Long, sister to his Uncle James Snodgrass's wife."

He then listed as John's children:

1. William Long Snodgrass, m. Margaret Hargon.
2. Margaret, m. John B. Stephens and had six children.
3. David, m. Elizabeth Walker; children not known.
4. Thomas, m. Caroline Martin and had nine children.
5. Ann, m. Dow Stephens and had five children.
6. Rebecca, m. Thomas Hargon and had nine children.
7. Benjamin, married three times: Hilliam, Penelope Strong, and Nancy Strong.
8. John, m. Louisa Byrd and had six children.
9. Alexander, m. Lucretia Turner and had a child, Martha Jane, who married Hamlin Caldwell and had seven children.
10. Sarah, m. Thomas Ross Mattox.
11. James, d. early.

Mr. J. D. Snodgrass then listed the children of the John Snodgrass who married Louisa Byrd:

1. William
2. James
3. Nathaniel
4. Thomas
5. Ann

Assuming that Mr. J. D. Snodgrass correctly stated the facts, he is a close relative to Mrs. Hurston. It will be noted, however, that his story of Col. William Snodgrass's family includes the John who married Jane Long, who was a sister of the wife of his Uncle James Snodgrass of Virginia.

Hence we have here brothers James & William. Both served in the Revolutionary War from Washington Co., Virginia. James died there, but William moved on into Tennessee. J. D. Snodgrass of Scottsboro and Mrs. Hurston obviously were from the Tennessee ancestor, and since James Snodgrass the soldier from Virginia died there and never went to Tennessee, any Revolutionary grave in that region belonged to Colonel William, unless there was an unidentified William, who also went to Tennessee.

Note 2[sic]: It would be most interesting to know where the records can be found of the widow Snodgrass who sought a pension on William's name.

Note 5: Note that in the James Snodgrass family, a Mrs. Lyons is listed as a daughter.

Note 6: Is the letter here referred to still in existence? If so, who has it?

Dear Madam:

In the year 1952, you were good enough to send me some data, showing your ancestry. Your grandfather was Alexander Snodgrass, your great-grandfather James D. Snodgrass, his wife Abigail Dunlap. You then stated that according to tradition, your great-great-grandfather was William Snodgrass, his wife Sarah Long. I am now convinced that the William Snodgrass you are descended from was NOT the William Snodgrass who died in Sullivan Co., Tennessee, but was the William Snodgrass who died in Washington Co., Virginia, in 1830. It seems entirely probable that this William of Washington Co., Virginia, was in the War of the Revolution, since it is known that every able bodied person 18 years old or older who could carry arms went with the patriots to Kings Mountain.

[Mrs. Hurston: I am sure he was at Kings Mountain with his brother James.]

I have taken the facts as they have been pieced together and prepared a sort of chart showing, as I see it, where your Snodgrass line fits into the Washington Co., Virginia, Snodgrass set of families. It is not a final draft, merely a set of facts which seem to fit and which appear to be the only explanation of who your great-grandfather was. You may keep this, but I hope you will return the enclosed questionnaire, and thus give me some leads I seek which will help me solve other problems.

I wonder if your grandfather left any copies of the manuscript he prepared telling of his family, his move to Alabama, and what happened to him after he went there. I note that Major J. D. Snodgrass of Scottsboro, Alabama, is deceased. I am wondering if you and the Mayor ever definitely decided just how you were related. He sent me some material, which I may have failed properly to interpret. As I understand it, he said he was descended from John Snodgrass who married a Miss Long, sister to Major James Snodgrass's wife. Did I misunderstand him? Was he closely related to your grandfather? P. and Katherine Walker Snodgrass. He was the oldest of five siblings. Nat graduated from William Hooper Council High School in 1960. He attended Alabama A&M University where he marched and played trumpet in the band. Nat was drafted and served in the United States Army during the Vietnam War. Although God was calling him to the ministry as a high school senior, he did not accept until after completing his military service.

After ministering for several years under his father at First Missionary Baptist Church on Church Street, on August 27, 1966, Horace married Margie Alice Wisdom of Stevenson, Alabama.
