

Migration Category Updates

I have looked very carefully at the Migration Category structure. The two-stream method works. I draw your attention to one feature. When you use the Migration Template to help create a set of interconnected categories, there is a feature which I think has not been thought through.

For example, a person migration from County Durham, England, to Pennsylvania, United States, goes into a category called (in the current nomenclature) **Migrants from County Durham to Pennsylvania**. The Migration Template creates a structure of Categories as shown below.



In the proposed new nomenclature, the structure looks like this:



I draw your attention to the diagonal connection between **County Durham, Emigrants to United States** and **United States, Immigrants**. There is no corresponding diagonal connection from **Pennsylvania, Immigrants from England** and **County Durham, Emigrants to United States**. My view is that the diagonal connection causes a problem. I suggest that you have a look at Category **Immigrants to United States**. The Category contains 109 subcategories as of today, 13 April 2019. The table below shows some of them.

The left-hand column shows a list of categories for Entities in any country. Ultimately there will be a very long list of categories.

I propose to remove the diagonal connection and in its place put an intermediate category. The Migration Template could set up a structure of the form shown below. The result of this change will be, for example, that Category **Immigrants to United States**, renamed as **United States**, **Immigrants**, will contain two lists of categories, one of the form **<name of state>**, **Immigrants** and a second list of form **United States**, **Immigrants from <name of country>**. Your two-stream structure remains intact.
