 My Grandpa, Albert Sr used to play Santa Claus for The Salvation Army in  
 Lock Haven, PA back in the 1940's.  
 (Aunt Sarah) said that they moved a lot between Central PA and Western  
 PA because he was a miner and he moved wherever there was work.  
 Yep, My Grandpa's parents were from Germany as well

Dad told me that Grandpa used to tell him that he was born on a boat  
 coming over from Germany. However, when Grandpa was born their boat  
 was around New Jersey either Hoboken or Hackensack, New Jersey, so  
 that is the birthplace that Grandpa Hamm used

I have found the death certificate for Grandpa Albert Hamm, Albert August  
 Hamm Senior was born on December 9, 1877, His social security number is  
 186-05-8244 or 186-65-8244. The middle set of numbers is not real clear so  
 try either one of those numbers. They list his birthplace as Hoboken, New  
 Jersey, ... father was Fred Hamm, his mother's name was Louise, but  
 there is no maiden name listed. Something odd is The signature on the  
 death certificate is Mary A. Hamm as the wife of Albert August Hamm  
 Senior, (Alberts wife was Ethel so) I have no idea who Mary is who is listed  
 on the death certificate.

According to Aunt Sarah Albert was married before and did visit Pittsburgh  
 area at some point. In an augment with his Wife Ethel she said something  
 "like well go back to your first wife".

(1/17/2003 Helen Hamm) I talked to Aunt Sarah yesterday. She said that  
 Grandpa owned a coal mine somewhere around Lock Haven, PA. My Aunt  
 Margaret, Uncle Don's wife, told me last night that Grandma wanted  
 Grandpa to sell the coal mine and move away from Lock Haven, but he did
