OBITUARY

Martin Hubbard was born in Indiana, Oct. 20, 1840, and died March 13, 1920, at the advanced age of 79 years, 4 months and 13 days. At the age of one year he moved with his parents to Gentry County Mo., near the town of Albany, where he grew to manhood. August 8, 1861, he was married to Margarette Stafford of Albany. Soon after their marriage they moved to Winterset, Iowa. To this union were born six children: Tilly J., Martha L., Allen M., Minnie A., Isaac A., Elizbeth B., Hubbard. Two of the daughters preceded their father in death.

Mr. Hubbard enlisted in Co. F, 39th Iowa infantry serving 3 ½ years or until the end of the war.

He joined the Masonic order in the year of 1872, being raised to the sublime degree of a Master Mason in Peabody Kan. some years later.

In the year of 1873 he moved to Marion County, Kan., taking a homestead on which he lived until 1884, moving thence to Barton County, where [he] lived until the year 1891, then moved to Kingfisher, Okla., living there until September 1919, when he moved to Hinton, where he resided at the time of his death.

Mr. Hubbard was a member of G.A.R. Post at Peabody Kan., and later of Kingfisher Post at Kingfisher Okla.

Near the age of 18 he was converted and united with M.E. Church. In 1878, he united with the Christian Church near Peabody, Kan.

Those left to mourn his loss are his wife, 2 sons, 2 daughters, 22 grandchildren and 2 great grandchildren, besides 2 brothers and 3 sisters.

The Funeral was held at the home of the deceased, Rev. Beal officiating, assisted by Rev. Gibble and Rev. Morrison. The Masonic lodge of Hinton then took charge, conducting the body to the cemetery, where the remains were laid to rest according to the time-honored custom of the Masons. Messrs. Tilton and F.M. Cackler, both soldiers of the civil war, attended the funeral, representing the G.A.R. Post.
