

VERDICT.—LUNACY CASES.

Judges and jurors will please note that, if a person who has had an attack of insanity and recovered therefrom, becomes again insane, the duration of the insanity should be reckoned from the first observed symptoms of the last attack and not from the beginning of the first attack. The fact of previous attacks can properly be noted as among the causes of subsequent attacks.

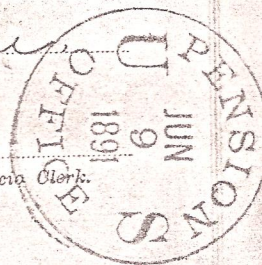
