

# Solving for the Unknown

### The No Math Edition

The Unknowns Project is on a mission to improve connections on WikiTree by identifying those ancestors who have been difficult to identify. Most of these are women, and honoring their lives and their contributions to our family history is an important goal for the project.



## How to Find "Unknown" Profiles

There are several ways to find profiles to work on:

Enter "Unknown" in the Last Name search box



Use "Limit Watchlist" to see which ones you manage or follow

## Getting ready to research



Look for Obvious Surname Hints

- For women: In places and eras where taking the husband's name is common practice, add married name as Current Last Name to facilitate searching
- Check for parents or siblings probably shares the same last name

#### Look for Obvious Surname Hints


- Read what's already on the profile is her name already in the sources?

Getting ready to research, cont'd

Look for Obvious Surname Hints

Consider the possibility that a woman's Last Name at Birth (LNAB) is the same as her married name.





Look for suggestions

- Correct any Data Doctor suggestions that are shown for the profile
  - Check the bottom of the profile while in Edit mode OR -
  - Use the Suggestion link on the Profile ID menu



Getting ready to research, cont'd

Bring the profile format up to standard

- Format the profile for readability
  - See <u>Help:Editing Tips</u>





Last, but definitely not least, check for duplicates

- Go to Profile ID menu, choose "Search for Matches"
  - With the additional information, you might be able to find duplicates
  - If you find a duplicate with a sourced last name, congratulations! Can you make more improvements to the profile?
- Go to Find > Search to do a more thorough search where you can sort the search results
- Propose merges if you can.
  - Come back and check in 30 days if no action has been taken on the merge.

## Rev Your Research Engines

WikiTree has a great tool for starting research for a person

- RootsSearch
  - available using the Research link on the bottom of the right side of any person profile or from the Profile ID menu

#### Collaboration

- Edit: As a member of the Trusted List you're invited to improve this profile and upload images.
- Private Messages: Send a private message to the Profile Manager. (Best when privacy is an issue.)
- Public Comments: These will appear below and on <u>Activity</u> <u>Feeds</u>. (Best for messages specifically directed to those editing this profile. Limit 20 per day.)
- Public Q&A: These will appear above and in the <u>Genealogist-to-Genealogist (G2G) Forum</u>. (Best for anything directed to the wider genealogy community.) ASK QUESTION

### Find-a-Grave

- □ For women, make sure you start with her married name
- If no dates have been found yet, use info from connected family members to estimate a good date range
- Burial location guesses good or bad?
- If you find a memorial always verify information with sources using another reliable repository.
- Rule of thumb: Use 3 sources showing family members together




#### □ The profile has exact dates, but there is no source. Is there Find - a - Grave memorial?





#### Consider broadening the date range if nothing is found on Find-a-Grave

Read the whole obituary or newspaper article cited on a profile for clues.


## Biography

SIX KILLED IN BUS-CAR CRASH.


Chandler, Ariz., May 3 (UP) - Five members of one family and a bus driver were killed tonight when a car apparently sped through a stop sign and collided with a bus. Two other children in the family were critically injured and may not live. Twenty-three passengers on the bus were injured. Highway Patrolman Coy Beasley said the car, driven by TIVES PERRY, 33, of Collidge, Ariz., sped through the stop sign at Norton's Corners, three miles east of here, at about 45 miles an hour. The car was flattened against the bus, turned over and burned. The bus careened 132 feet along the road and smashed into a tree. Besides PERRY, the dead were his sister-inlaw, MRS. HELEN CARTER, 45, of Coolidge, and three of her children, RUTH, 17, HELEN, 12, and SUE ANN, 6. Her two sons, DONALD, 10, and CARMEN, 11, were in critical condition. The dead bus driver was C. R. WINNER, 39, Phoenix.


## Use alternative names on the profile to look for possible surnames or other married names

Search for wife's profile on FamilySearch

- Look for Alabama marriage records in 1909
- Click the link for his name in the marriage record to see if he has a FamilySearch profile
- Check his family connections to verify his last name – he is the son of a "Mantel"

#### □ Stuck on the wife? Start with the husband!

- □ Start search husband's profile
- □ Use found records for him to locate his FS profile
- □ Check his source list for clues
- □ Follow link on FamilySearch to get to her FS profile & check her sources
- Look for name misspellings



## Help me! I'm still stuck!!

More tips for the tough ones ....

- Gedcom-created profiles
  - Check original Profile Manager's contribution feed for profiles created about the same time
  - Search WikiTree for the name of the GEDCOM file
- Use G2G to ask for help
  - Share everything you know about the person dates, locations, family members, etc
  - > Use tags to attract the attention of members who might be able to help



## Hallelujah! I found a name!

- □ Is the profile orphaned?
  - > Adopt it

 $\succ$ 

- Change the name.
  - Click the Privacy Tab > Trusted List and use the "Remove Yourself" button to orphan it again.
- Does it have a profile manager?
  - Leave a friendly comment with sources & information and ask the Profile Manager to change it. Follow up on this in a couple of weeks.
  - Or ... use the "Request to join this profile's Trusted List" link to request permission to edit the profile.
  - Remove yourself from the Trusted List when you're done.



## Dead Ends

If after all your efforts, you have not been able to identify the surname, write a very descriptive **Research Notes** on the profile ...

- Where did you search?
- What did you search for?
- □ When did yo<mark>u s</mark>earch?

• I checked FamilySearch, Find-a-Grave, and Ancestry and couldn't find anything. – ~~~~

#### Hold on ... what is "~~~~" ??

That little notation will leave a timestamp when you save your changes. It will include a link to your profile so that anyone stopping by later will know who left the note and when.



## Other Improvements to Consider



- Did you add sources containing information about children or other relatives who don't have profiles?
  - Add [[Category: Location, Needs Profiles Created]] (location can be a state, county or country whichever one you have)
- □ If the race of the person represented by the profile is Black, please add the **{{African American sticker}}**. The <u>US Black Heritage Project</u> can then follow up with additional research.
- Add as many categories as you can for locations. Someone researching those locations might have more information about the family for your Unknown.



If you haven't found much information, estimate a date using the following rules of thumb:

- □ For men
  - Wife's birth date 5 years
  - Oldest child's birth date 25 years
- For women
  - Husband's birth date + 5 years
  - Oldest child's birth date 20 years
- □ Make sure to include the **{{Estimated Date}}** template & a Research Note
