This Indenture made the 25th day of November in the year our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifteen between Henry Sence and Elizabeth his wife of the County of Harrison and Commonwealth of Virginia of the one part and Jesse Hunkle of Pennington County and Commonwealth of Virginia of the other part Witnesseth that they the said Henry Sence and Elizabeth his wife for and in consideration of the sum of three hundred dollars to them in hand paid by the said Jesse Hunkle the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said Jesse Hunkle his heirs and assigns forever a certain tract or parcel of land situate lying and being on the east side of the north fork mountain between Joseph Briggs land and the pretty ridge in the County of Pennington aforesaid containing ninety acres be the same more or less and Bounded and described follows to wit Beginning at a walnut and ash in the head of a hollow thence running S. 81. 10. 34. poles to a chestnut tree N. 81. 10. 34. poles to two white oaks and red oak near a spring S. 64. 16. 38. poles to white oak near some rocks S. 12. 10. 50. poles to two pines and black oak sapling S. 12. 10. 84. poles to three black oak saplings and a ridge N. 77. E. 64. poles to a chestnut tree S. 77. E. 20. poles to an elm or Locust & red oak sapling at the foot of a hill and thence N. 15. E. 140. poles to the
