

GENEALOGY

Following is a translation from Norwegian by James Hanson of a genealogy of his mother, Gyda Henriksen, born September 30, 1881, dating back to 1579. This information was assembled over a long period of time by my mother's cousin, Andreas Markussen, from Norwegian government reords in archives in Trondheim and Oslo and registered by Johan G. Reppe, Trondheim.

I want to comment that these robust, stoic people who lived so long ago and so far north were flesh and blood people with similar wants that we have. You will notice that many men remarried due to their wives dying in childbirth—there were no hospitals in this area and few doctors. You will also notice that many women remarried because of the hazards in their husband's employment. Also, there must have been some black sheep but these historical records do not show this. Records do, however, show that many of these ancestors left considerable estates. From 1419 to 1815 Denmark ruled Norway and required military service and considerable taxes. When Denmark chose to support Napoleon in 1810 she lost Norway in 1815, at which time Sweden ruled Norway until 1905 when Norway became free.

Ole Olsen was born in 1579 in Misvar, Salten and records show he paid about 40 pounds of butter as taxes for his land and house (around 1600 the landowners began paying taxes in grains, dried fish, salt, hemp, hides and skins). We find no record of his wife but assume it was a second marriage when, at age 64, he sired (in 1643) Ingebrigt Olsen, born at Salten, died at Tarstad in 1711, burial at Evenes Cemetery April 16, 1711, before a large gathering of mourners. Ingebrigt Olsen was schooled in carpentry and later built the first church at Ankenes (across the fjord from Narvik) between 1658 and 1661 and paid for by the citizens of Ankenes. In 1676 to 1677 he built Ofoten's main church at Evenes (where we now find a modern airport) which

replaced an earlier church built in 1250 by Hakon Hakonsen.

In 1690 he became sheriff of Ofoten, a position he maintained until his death.

He was married to Øllegard Aas.

He could not read or write but used this sign or signature on his office records:

In Norwegian it is referred to as a "Bumerke".

Ingebrigt and Øllegard had two sons.

Knut Ingebrigtsen was born in 1669 at Tarstad and died in 1743 and the settlement of his estate indicated considerable property for that period. He was married in 1708 to a widow, Kisten Pedersdatter, and thereby came into possession of a fishing schooner, a property at Bjeldgam and one-fourth of a property at Liland in Ofoten. His wife Kirsten was born in 1684 at Vidrek in Ofoten and died December 30, 1756 at Bjeldgam.

The second son, Lars, was born January 30, 1681 at Tarstad and died in the same place February 2, 1753. He inherited half of the Engebrigt Olsen lands at Tarstad and became sheriff of Ofoten after his father's death. Lars married his brother's wife's sister, Bergitte Pedersdatter, who was born in 1686 and died December 1, 1748. They had nine children. Both Knut and Lars Ingebrigtsen were taught to read and write by assistant pastor Gabriel Augustinussen Rogn. Knut and Kirsten's children were-(Interestingly they all took their mother's surname of Aas for their surname);

1-- Ingebrigt Knutsen, born 1713 at Bjellgam, died there unmarried in 1753.

- 2-- Feder Knutson, born 1715 at Bjeldgam; early death.
- 3--Karen Knutsdatter, born August 15, 1717; no further record.
- 4--gllegard Knutsdatter, born November 22, 1719 at Bjeldgam, died February 28, 1783. She married her cousin, ship owner and farmer Peder Mogensen, born 1715 at Vidrek and died at the same place April 24, 1780. The settlement of his estate showed him quite well-to-do. His family had good-sized boats that traveled from North Norway to Bergen and a number of these boats were named "Jomfru Maria" or "Virgin Mary".
- 5--Anna Knutsdatter, born 1721 at Bjeldgam, died 1769 in Taraldsvik (a part of Narvik where a number of our relatives now live), she was married twice -- with farmer and ship owner Aksel Aksselsen of Taraldsvik, born 1691 d. 1750, son of a farmer at Framnes (now a part of Narvik) b. 1657. d. December 11, 1750, second marriage to Ole Henriksen Mejer, b. 1717 in Taraldsvik, d. same place 1782, son of Henrik Mejer of Taraldsvik. Her first marriage resulted in 7 children, the second in three children.
- 6--Margreth Knutsdatter, born August 3, 1723 at Bjeldgam, died 1769. She married her cousin, farmer and ship owner Aksel Mogensen, from Vidrak, born 1721, died same placeMarch 3, 1771. After her death Mogensen married Maren Kristine Rohde born 1736, died 1804. After his death she married a relatively wealthy man named Henrik Henriksen Mejer, born 1748 at Leland, died 1802.
- * 7--Ole Knutsen, born October 23, 1725 at Bjeldgam, died same place January 24, 1792. He was a farmer and ship-owner and owned considerable property at Leland. He, too, was married twice, the first in Evenes Church January 3, 1754 with Karen Andfinsdatter Røgh, born 1727 at Sommerseth, Hammerøy, died 1761 at Bjeldgam. His second marrige is important to us as we are descended from that branch. Ole Knutsen Aas' second marriage took place in the Lodingen Church in 1762 with Maren Pedersdatter, born 1739 at Kjopsvik, Tysfjord, baptized April 5, 1739, died July 7, 1807 at Bjeldgam in Ofoten near Evenes. She was the daughter of ship owner and farmer Peder Federsen, who was married in 1738 to Barbara Christensdatter Kildal in the Lodingen Church--she was the daughter of farmer and boat owner in Kjøpsvik, Christian Kildal, born 1683 in Kristiansand, South Norway, died 1758.

8--Hans Knutsen, born December 11, 1727 at Bjeldgsm, died 1774 at Liland where he owned land, was a fisherman and seaman. He married 17 August 1757 to Birgitte Gabrielsdatter, born 1733 at Leirvik in Ankenes.

The fourth generation of Ole Knutsen Ass:

1--Knut Olsen Aas, born 1754 at Bjeldgam, died 1806 at Upper Leland in Ofoten, where he was a landowner, boat owner and farmer. He was married in the nearby Evenes Church February 2, 1785 with a younger sister of his ster-mother, Kirsten Marie Peders' Datter, born 1751 at Kjopsvik, Tysfjord, died July 6, 1807 at Liland.

2--Kirsten Olsdatter Aas, born 1757 at Ballangen, baptized at Easter time, died November 11, 1837 at Skogshamm in Dyroy. She was married in 1780 with farmer and fisherman Michel Hansen at Skogshamm in Dyrøy, born 1747, died 1829. History indicates she had a little love affair and was forced to marry beneath her station.

- 3. Christian Olsen Aas, born 1758, died June 29, 1784; church records show that he died of sea sickness, was unmarried and lived at home.
- 4. Anfinn Røgov Olsen Aas, born 1759 at Bjeldgam, baptized at Easter, died February 6, 1830 at Nedre Selseth in Ibested, where he was a farmer and ran an inn. He was married to Anna Martha Trane, born 1760. They had two daughters and one son who died young.
- 5. Margarethe Olsdatter Aas, born March 3, 1759 at Bjeldgaam, died 1840 at Tovik in Trondenes. She was married twice; first, December 8, 1784 at Liland in Ofoten to Hartvig Christensen Hevding, born February 17, 1759 at Leiland, died same place 1785; second marriage to ship owner Edis Lech Sparboe, at the Trondenes church-he was born in 1765 at Tovik and died April 26, 1828 at Tovik.
- 6. Karen Olsdatter Aas born 1760 at Bjeldgam. She was married to Kristian Kildal, born 1745 at Korsnes in Tysfjord, died September 9, 1802. He was the son of Peder Pedersen of Korsnes and Barbara Christiansdatter Kildal. He took his mother's name as his surname. On an auction October 14, 1780, he bought a farm at Finseth in Hamarøy where operated a store and an inn until 1799 when he leased it to Jacob Mas.
- 7. Hans Warberg Aas, born 1755 at Bjeldgam, died April 10, 1787 at Taraldsvik in Ankenes where he farmed. He married the widow Anne Pedersdatter at Evenes Church July 22, 1783 who was born 1746 at Kjøpsvik, Tysfjord. (She was a sister of Hans Warberg Aas stepmother.
- *8. Feder Olsen Aas, born August 29, 1763 at Bjeldgam, died 1831 at Tovik in Trondenes. He was a first mate on a ship and later farmed. He married Johanna Margrethe Sparboe, born 1768 on December 23, 1792 in Trondenes Church. She died May 5, 1839 in Tovik. Johanna's father was Hans Ravn Sparboe, born 1719lin Trondines, died April 19, 1785—he was a ship owner and farmer. He was married twice: First Nov. 25, 1748 with Johanna Margretha Harr, born 1700; Second to Margretha Blom, born in Denmark. (Under the 1801 Census she was listed as 66 years, died November 20, 1822 which indicated she was 81 years of age.

Hans Sparboe was the son of Hans Eriksen Sparboe, born 1687 in Trondelag. He had an important job in the government and was later a sheriff in Sand as well as a farmer in Vika, died November 17, 1754. He was married to Reborg Hansdatter Ravn, born 1694 at Rokenes in Trondenes, died 1776 at age 82. Reborg was the daughter of Hans Rasmussen Ravn, born 1646, died 1717. He was ship owner and farmer at Rokenes. He was married to widow Maren Mikkelsdatter and afterMaren's death to Johanna Nilsdatter from Sorvik in Trondnes. Johanna was the daughter of Nils Mortensen (whose birth date we do not have) he died 1696 at Sorvik in Trondenes where records show he lived from 1653 to 1661. He represented the King of Denmark who ruled Norway at this time in civil matters and was also an ombundsman for the bishop, an important position. He married Riborg Danielsdatter Bull born at Trondheim. She was earlier married to Jens Christiansen Hveding of Lofoten. She and Jens presented the middle chandelier to the Trondenes church and their names are engraved on it.

Nels Mortensen left a record of a debt incurred by the Trondenes Church dated May 22, 1685 at Sørvik. It is interesting to note what an important part the church played in that era in the lives of the people.

- 9. Catrine Kildal Olsdatter Aas, born June 20, 1768 at Bjeldgam, died there June 22, 1784 (many children and young people died of diptheria, scarlet fever, etc. in those years.)
- 10. Ole Olsen Aas, born 1774, died June 18, 1784 evidently in an epidemic when his sister Catrine died.
- 11. Barbroe Dorthea Kildal Olsdatter Aas born 1770 at Bjeldgam, died same place November 26, 1830. She was married twice, first in 1799 with Aron Arctander born September 19, 1760 at Evenes, die September 9, 1807 at Bjeldgam-he was the son of the church pastor assigned to Ofoten, Peder Archtander, born June 16, 1729 at Hammerfest, died 1807 at Skar and his wife, Bolette Marie Schrøder, died March 21, 1800 at Evenes, 73 years of age. Aron Archtinder was a business man in Lodingen. Barbro's second marriage was to widower Johan Heitman, born 1772, died December 17, 1850 at Bjeldgam. He was a sheriff and owned property at Bjeldgam. It is interesting to note that he was best man at the wedding of my great-grandparents, Christian Hansen Seines and Margrethe Blom's wedding, July 28, 1816.
- 12. Ane Dorthea Olsdatter Aas, born May 5, 1779 at Bjeldgam, married October 7, 1801 with Peder Jorgen Danilsen Dass, born 1779, at Lodingen. He was a fisherman and farmer at Tarstad. On January 1, 1805 he and the crew on his cod fishing boat were lost on a trip out of Kabelvag near Skrava. On October 23, 1807 Ane Dorthea married bachelor Jens Olsen, born 1774, died March 3, 1844. He was a farmer and fisherman at Tarstad.
- 13. Anna Margrethe Olsdatter Aas, born 1772 at Bjeldgam. She was married at her home in Bjeldgam after special permission by the King on Oct. 22, 1792 to innkeeper and shipowner Torleiv Faulsen, born 1763, died 1807 in Lyngvar in Lofoten which was a long-established inn and harbor for ships which he owned. Since they had no children, records show that on December 21, 1798 a will was drawn up for disposition of the property which fell to her by his death in July 2, 1807, confirmed by Henry Christian the 7th.

Fifth Generation: The children of Feder Olsen Aas and Johanna Sparboe Trondes follow:

- * 1. Margrethe Benedicta Blom Pedersdatter Aas, born 1792 (She was my great grandmother and grandmother of my mother.) She was 9 years old in 1801, living with her parents at Bjeldgam, where she was called Margrethe Blom, named for her mother's mother, died April 6, 1845, buried April 27, aged 54 years. She was married to my great-grandfather July 28, 1816 in the Evenes church to Christian Hansen, born 1782 in Leirvik in Ofoten. He was a farmer and fisherman at Seines on Ofoten. He received a karbrev from his son Markus dated September 4, 1847 (Karbrev is a legal term for lifetime use of a house and land)
 - Christian Hansen's ancestors on his father's side:
 His father, Hans Helegesen, was born 1748 at Tvera in Skjerstad baptised December 27, 1748. He was a farmer and fisherman who lived

at Leirvik in Ofoten. Inheritance records dated April 16, 1806 indicate some wealth for that time period. He had two marriages, the first November 8, 1777 with the widow Maren Jonsdatter, born 1740 at Treldal in Ofoten, died May 5. 1792 at Leirvik and buried there. She was first married to a farmer in Leirvik, Abraham Gabrielsen who died June 1, 1773 at 43 year with whom she had six children. His next marriage was to Siri Ølsdatter, born in Ofoten. In the census of 1801 she was 29 years of age; there were no children in this marriage.

Hans Helgesen's father was Helga Christoffersen who lived at Tvera in Skjerstad. Hans Helgesen's mother's side of the family:

His mother was Maren Jonsdatter. Her father was Jon Akselsen, born 1702 at Treldal, died same place in 1769. He was a farmer and fisherman in Treldal in Ofoten, quite well to do. As some official records show, he owned 506 Specie Dollars, a lot of money in those days. He was married to Berta Alsdatter. born 1700---at Fagernes in Ofoten, died1769 at Treldal, buried in a grave with her husband in that year. They had two sons and two daughters. Jon Akselsen was the son of Aksel Pedersen, born 1666 in Treldal, died 1726, farmer and fisherman in Treldal. He was married to Karen Larsdatter. Aksel Pedersen was a son of Peder Akselsen, born 1630, farmer in Treldal. died 1701.

Berith Olsdatter was the daughter of Ole Amundsen, born 1666 at Fagernes, farmer and fisherman.

Hans Helgesen and Maren Jonsdatter (my great, great grandparents on my mother's side) had two sons in their marriage:

1. Johan Hansen, born November 1, 1779 in Leirvik, farmer and fisherman, married November 28, 1815 in Ankenes with Øllegard Oline Michels Michelsdatter, born 1780, died October 27, 1840; an interesting note-Øllegard Oline had a twin brother, Peder-he was a farmer in Hergot. He drowned October 12, 1832 when a whale ran into his fishing boat at Inner Rombaksfjord-very close to where my father, John Hanson and his mother Hannah Olsen operated a small hotel and restaurant about 1900 when the railroad was being built to Narvik. I have gone swimming in this fjord at this point where my ancestor lost his life because he could not swim.

Sixth Generation: Their second son was Christen Hansen, my great grandfather, born 1782. He married Margrete Blom July 28, 1816 in presence of Sheriff Johan Heitman, the bride's uncle, and P. Gabrielsen as ring bearer and best man.

Christen Hansen and Margete's children are here listed:

- 1. Hans Mantinus Christensen, born 1817 at Seines, baptized after Pentecost--no other information available.
- 2. Markus Christensen, born 13 July 1823 at Seines in Ofoten, died same place June 3, 1907, land owner, farmer and fisherman. Inheritance records show on May 25, 1846 he took over his father's farm and property when his mother died. He was also a civil officer in the county government. Under the 1875 Census it indicated that all his children were at home and that he

owned one horse, 14 milk cows, 2 heifers, 16 sheep, 2 goats and 2 pigs, also that he raised barley and potatoes. He married Bereth - Olsdatter, born May 14, 1827 at Leirvik in Ofoten, baptized July 17, and died 1889.

Her antecedents were as follows: Her father was Ole Hansen, born September 10, 1789 in Taraldsvik, raised in Narvik and was a farmer and fisherman in Leirvik. He married in Ankenes Church December 24, 1822 with Ingeborg Akseldatter. His father was Hans Pedersen, born 1758 at Yetterbø, farmer and fisherman in Narvik, died 1811. He was married to Bereth Jonsdatter, born 1759 in Narvik. Hans Pedersen's parents were Peder Olsen, born 1732 at Lilandskar, farmer and fisherman at Yterbø, drowned February 1, 1788. He married Ellen Larsdatter July 8, 1756 at Evenes, who was born at Balsnes, died February 17, 1791. Bareth Jonsdatter's parents were Jon Andersen, born 1732 in Narvik, farmer and fisherman whose wife was Agnes Einarsdatter, born 1725 at Framnes.

Jon Andersen was a son of Anders Pedersen, farmer and fisherman of Narvik. Agnes Einarsdatter was a daughter of Einar Andersen, born 1679, died 1762, farmer and fisherman at Framnes. His parents were Anders Nilsen, born 1652, died 1762, farmer and fisherman at Lille Haksvik in Ankenes and wife Agnes Einarsdatter.

On her mothers side: Ingeborg Akselsdatter, born February 19, 1796 at Tarvalfjord. She lived as a maid and farm worker at Larvik. She was a daughter of Axel Axelsen, born 1761, a farmer and fisherman at Tarvaldfjord in Ankenes, married to Marit Gabrielsdatter on November 30, 1792, born 1758 at Seines, died 1811. Axel Axelsen was a son of Axel Axelsen who was 77 years of age in 1801 and who lived with his son, whose wife was Ingeborg Andersdatter, born 1728 in Narvik, died December 14, 1786. That Axel Axelsen was a son of Axel Axelsen, born 1691, farmer in Narvik and he was a son of Axel Andersen, born 1656, farmer in Narvik.

- 3. Henrik Hans Mejer Christensen, my mother's father, was born November 10,1828, died 1895 at Øyjord. Baptized at home by Rasmus Gabrielsen Seines, farmer and fisherman at Øyjord in Ofoten. He married Abelone Petersdatter, born 1844 in Ankenes, died 1895. Henrik Christensen's first child was with an unknown girl from Seines, named Johan Henriksen, born September 29, 1861--who I knew well on my first visit to Norway in 1927. He lived and farmed in nearby Bjerkvik. He died there in his mid-eighties, a respected and well-regarded person. His wife was Albertina. Henrik and Abelone's children follow:
- 1. Peder Henriksen, born 1864, died 1940, farmer and merchant, married Hansina from Hamnes.
- 2. Magrete, born 1865, died very young.
- 3. Jorgen (the first) died of pneumonia at age 13.
- 4. Yetta, born 1870, died in the fifties, married Erich Wiker from Warmland, Sweden.
- 5. Margrete, the second, born 1876, married Sven Wilhemsen and settled in Finsnes where they had 7 or 8 children.
- 6. Hans, born 1878, died 1947, Did not marry and lived his whole life in dyjord.

7. Gyda, my mother, born September 29, 1881, died December 12, 1954, married John Hanson of Ballangen on March 29, 1906 at Calumet, Michigan; he was born May 25, 1867 and died May 16, 1950.

8. Kirsten, born April 8, 1883, died August 21, 1970, married Elias Jensen of Ballangen at Calumet, Michigan, also on March 29, 1906.

9, Jorgen, the second, born 1886, died in an explosion at Narvik about 1916 and left a widow and daughter named Astrid.

The children of Feder Henriksen and Hansina:
1. Hilberg Henriksen, born January 8, 1892, died November 10, 1956;
married Berta from Tysfjord, born September 1, 1891, died June 19, 1984.
2. Harald Henriksen, born 1893, married Klara from Svolver; three sons:

ødd, Ivar and Harald. The three sons are now in their sixties and seventies and live in Narvik.

3. Borghild Henriksen, born March 23, 1897, died January 9, 1991, married Johan Mathias Johansen from Gapøy in November, 1923.

4. Haldis Henriksen, born May 19, 1899, died 1981, married John Meier Eggen, born September 9, 1892 at Bardu, died 1967.

The children and grandchildren of Hilberg and Berta Henriksen are: 1. Harald Henriksen, b. Sept. 19, 1914, d. Feb. 11, 1981; married Ruth born Nov. 21, 1917; their children are Liv born Jan. 9, 1944, married to Jon Magistad; their children—a daughter Tove born 1977 and Harald born 1980—Second daughter Unn Tove, born 1950, married with two sons. 2. Agot Henriksen, b. Aug. 24, 1916, married Asbjorn Elvevold April 8, 1941 who was born March 19, 1911, died Jan. 3, 1984—their children: Bjørn born Sept. 3, 1942, Ove. born August 11, 1947; Svein, born May 22, 1949.

The children and grandchildren of Johan and Borghild Johansen: 1. Peder John, born Feb. 10, 1926, d. May 22, 1945 in the massive battle of the U.S. against Japan at Okinawa in World War II; 2. Esther Elenor born Sept. 2, 1928, died Aug. 11, 1976; married Roger Yeater Jan. 28, 1950; their children: Valle Ann Cruz, born Nov. 16, 1960, M. Michael Cruz Jan. 28, 1989, one child Lauren Ashleigh Cruz b. 4. Hildur, born January 28, 1902, married a Hollander named Pronk and

lived many years in Amsterdam. Now lives in Oslo.

5. Johan, born July 15, 1904, died around 1973, married Borghild from Ballangen, born Feb. 28, 1914.

6. Anna, born April 12, 1908, died about 1984, married Frans Osker

Johansen, born July 14, 1902.

7. Arne, born July 30, 1910, married Inga Larsen, born Oct. 5, 1909

The children and grandchildren of Johanna Wiker Johansen are:

archaic language of centuries ago to the many letters and 'phone calls
to get this information. I am indebted to many for help: Ester Fletcher
who made many 'phone calls to Norway, to Norma Hanson, and Thordis Norris
and to my wife, Katherine, for doing the typing.

The Norwegian part of our people lived well north of the Arctic Circle in an area extending from 10 miles east of Narvik to about 40 miles west of Narvik and north and south about 20 miles. They are able to live here due to a gift from the New World--the Gulf Stream which makes this region livable due to its warmth.

The greatest drama of this beautiful fjord area occured a few days after Germany seized Norway April 9, 1941 when Great Britain sent its huge 30,000-ton battleship "Warsprite" into the fjord area and within two hours destroyed eight German warships-the Allies fought and held this region for six weeks but were forced to retreat, leaving 1,200 Allied soldiers buried in Narvik.

It is interesting to note that the sun is last seen November 6 at Øyjord where my mother was born, and does not reappear until February 10.

Several of Thordis Norris' grandchildren and Alfred Hanson's great-grandchildren born in the last two years should live to the year 2,079, making it 500 years since our ancestor Ole Olsen was born in 1,579 in Arctic Norway.
