 miture I also do give to my loving wife Johana Drew my Dwelling Plan-
 tation now live upon, untill my son Anthony Drew shall arrive at the Age
 of one and Twenty years with necessary Timber for the Plantations use.
 Item I give and bequeath to my son Anthony Drew, all my Tracts and par-
 cels of lands known by the names of Drews Inlargement containing Eight
 hundred and eighty eight Acres, and Collets meadow containing One hun-
 dred and fifty Acres, and Thomas Arms desire containing One hundred
 Acres, to him and his heirs (lawfully begotten) forever, but in case he
 should die without lawfull Issue, and the Child my wife is now going
 with should prove a boy, then to fall to him the said Child but in case it
 should prove a girl, then to be divided equally amongst my four daughters.
 Item I also appoint William Gheislin, and Robert Lusby, my loving friends
 to be sole Executors of this last Will and Testament, and it is my desire and
 Request that my son Anthony Drew be brought up and Educated under
 the Care of M^r William Gheislin of Annapolis, It is likewise my desire and
 Request that my two daughters Mary Ann and Drucilla Drew be brought
 up and Educated under the care of M^r Robert Lusby, of Kent County, untill
 they be of the Age of sixteen, allso it is my desire and Request that my daugh-
 ter Frances Drew be Educated under the care of the foresaid M^r William
 Gheislin untill she arrive at the Age of sixteen. Item I give and bequeath
 all the Remainder of my personall Estate to my son Anthony and my three
 daughters and the Child my wife is now going with to be equally divided
 betwixt them. Lastly I do Ratifie and affirm this to be my last Will and
 Testament. In witness whereof I've sett my hand and Seal this seventh
 day January in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and
 thirty five.
