Flatbush. No 2 Feb. 3. 16<sup>79</sup>/<sub>80</sub> Bill of sale from Minne Johannes (signed Mynne Johannes) to William Morris for all housing and land (about 90 acres upland with fence) in Midwout, alias Flatbush, s/s of Hills. (P.1)
