Henry Watkins, Sr., Henrico County, Virginia, was a Quaker, of Welch descent, and his name is mentioned many times in Quaker records. He was born some time about 1671.

My dear Alexander:

The fore-going list will be of interest to you.

My authority for the last two items in the list is President Joseph D. Eggleston of Hampden-Sydney College, Virginia, who says that I (A.F.W.) am descended from Henry Watkins, Jr., the son of Henry Watkins, Sr., of Henrico County, Va.

This implies that John and Benjamin Watkins, of Powhatan County, Va., were descendents (possibly sons) of Henry, Jr., the son of Henry, Sr. It is not without significance in the premises that Benjamin Watkins, in a letter to your great-grand father, Asa Watkins, speaks of having a son, named Henry. The letter was written in May, 1830.
