I Charles Rouchhould of Baltimore County being sick in Body but of sound and perfect sense and memory thanks be to Almighty God for the same and being unwilling to dye intestate do hereby appoint this my last will and Testament revoking all wills heretofore by me made in form following First my will is that all my just Debts should be justly paid. Item I give and bequeath unto my son Charles Rouchhould one Tract of Land call'd Dunkins Chance lying in Annapolis County, to him his heirs and assigns, likewise I give unto my said son Charles one large Gun. Item I give and bequeath unto my three sons Wright Rouchhould, Reason Rouchhould and Asa Rouchhould the Tract of Land whereon I live call'd Rishafons dwell to be equally divided amongst them, to them their heirs and assigns forever. Item I give and bequeath unto my son Wright Rouchhould one Sott of Pistols holsters and sword. Item I give and bequeath unto my son Reason Rouchhould one small Gun likewise to my son Asa Rouchhould one small Gun. Item I give and bequeath unto my son John Rouchhould Ten shillings current money. Item I give and bequeath all the remainder of my Estate to be equally divided amongst all my children, my son John Rouchhould excepted, not being to have any part thereof. Item my further will and desire is that Wright Rouchhould, Reason Rouchhould, and Asa Rouchhould should be for themselves at Eighteen Years of Age. Item I hereby appoint my loving wife Elizabeth Rouchhould executrix of this my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this seventeenth Day of August 1741 signed sealed and acknowledged to be his last Will and Testament in presence of --- Charles Rouchhould

Item I will and require that my Executrix do and shall well and truly, and with all convenient speed pay, satisfy and fully discharge unto the said Mary Hanfon and her heirs, the full of her paternal portion, for which I and Capt. Robert North are jointly bound to Baltimore County Court. Item I give and bequeath unto my well beloved daughter Agnes Walker all the lands Tenements and Hereditaments whatsoever, of which you now possess unto her the said Agnes Walker and her heirs lawfully begotten of her Body forever, but in case she dies in non age, or without lawfull issue begotten of her Body, then I give and bequeath all my lands Tenements and Hereditaments in manner and form following Vizt.
