H. Benton Barracks near St. Louis Mo., Apl. 25" 1863 with "Bronchitis" and discharged from service June 3" 1863.

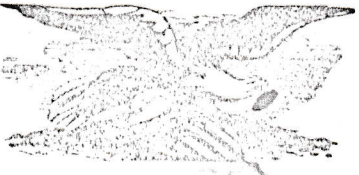
