Summary:

The excerpt, transcribed below, from the Chester County Archives did not include the entire original document. It suggests that James Brown (who by this time was recently deceased) and his wife Honour did not pay Flower for the land they bought from him; Flower sued and was granted an order for the sale of two lots plus two acres of trees in Chichester, which the Sheriff sold to John Piggot.
