I, Torger G. Olson of the Town of Summer in the
 County of Trempealeau and State of Wisconsin
 being of sound mind and memory and mindful
 of the uncertainties of human life, do make
 publish and declare this my last Will and testament in manner following
 First. I give, grant, devise and bequeath unto my wife Christina F. Olson, the use, enjoyment and occupancy of all the real and personal property of every name and description of which I may die possessed, for the purposes and upon the conditions hereinafter expressed she to care for and support each of the children hereinafter named until they become of age, providing each with a good common school education, so far as possible, and she to sell and dispose of all the personal property of which I may die possessed, and of the income thereof and of all my real estate ~~estate~~ from time to time as to her may seem to the best interests of all concerned, and the proceeds thereof after all living and other necessary expenses, incurred in the support of herself and our children as herein provided and in the care and management of the real estate to be paid and applied on all debts that I may owe at the time of my decease including the mortgage now secured on my real estate.

Second. At the time of the decease of my said wife, then I give, grant, devise and bequeath all the real estate of which I may die possessed and all personal property belonging to my estate and then remaining undisposed of, to my children as follows. To my daughter Anna F. Olson and my sons Albert B. Olson and Carl F. Olson to each four twenty firsts ($\frac{4}{21}^{th}$) thereof and to my daughters Julia C. Olson, Bergetta M. Olson, and Allie F. Olson to each three twenty firsts ($\frac{3}{21}^{th}$) thereof, providing that no division of said real estate shall be made

until my youngest child aforesaid then living shall have arrived at full age.


Third. In case my said wife shall remain, then she shall not permit anyone, except a present member of my family to live in, use or occupy any of said real estate or dispose of any of said personal property providing the same shall be objected to by any of ~~the~~ my said children.

Fourth. After all my said debts have been paid, then my said wife may at any time as she may think best dispose of any of my said personal property and pay the proceeds to my said children in proportion as aforesaid, holding on interest the share of any child then not of age.

Fifth. I do further direct that in case of the decease of my said wife before each of my said children shall have arrived at full age then the income of my said real estate, so far as necessary to be used for the support of such minor child or children until they become of age.

Sixth. I hereby nominate and appoint my wife Christina T. Olson as Executrix of this my last will and testament and I hereby authorize and empower the said Christina T. Olson to compound, compromise and settle any claim or demand which may be against or in favor of my said Estate.

The matter of hearing the proofs of the instrument propounded by Christina T. Olson as the last will and testament of Forger J. Olson deceased, having come on to be heard at this regular November term of said Court, and it appearing that due Notice of the time and place of such hearing had been duly given, as required, by ~~law~~ the order of the Court therein made on the fourth day of October A.D. 1890.

And the said propounder having appeared (and H.A. Anderson Esq of Whitehall being duly appointed special guardian for Anna T. Olson Albert B. Olson, Carl J. Olson, Julia C. Olson, Bergitta M. Olson and Ollie T. Olson minors interested and appearing for them) and no person opposing and Ira B Bradford one of the subscribing

witnesses to said instrument having been produced, sworn and examined and other witnesses having been produced sworn and examined; after hearing the evidence and the arguments by the counsel for the respective parties, upon consideration thereof the Court finds, That said Torger G. Olson died at the town of Sumner on the 16th day of August A. D. 1890.

That at the time of his death he was an inhabitant of the town of Sumner in said County of Trempealeau:

That on the Seventy-eight day of July A. D. 1890 the said Torger G. Olson was of full age, and was also of sound mind; that on the day last aforesaid at the said town of Sumner in said County the said instrument was signed by said Torger G. Olson.

That said instrument was at the time duly attested and subscribed by Tra B Bradford, E. A. Olson and Anne Anderson who were competent witnesses thereto, in the presence of said Torger G. Olson, who at the time declared it to be his will.

That said instrument is the last will and testament of said Torger G. Olson deceased; in all things duly executed.

Wherefore it is ordered and decreed, that said instrument be allowed; and probate thereof granted as the last will and testament of said Torger G. Olson deceased.
