The recommended Wikitree updates are based on the most likely but not necessarily the correct result.

The aim is just to eliminate gross errors, and provide consolidated information for future research.

The lack of response from the profile managers involved demonstrates a regrettable disregard for the Wikitree principles.

Purpose

Several profiles in Wikitree have very obvious errors.

Camp-20	Samuel Camp	1645 -1645	Samuel died in infancy but is shown as having three children Refer to page 107.
Camp-888	Mary Camp	1663 - 1691	Mary married two different spouse in the same year. Refer to page 53.
Camp-885	Lt. Samuel Camp	1643 - 1735	Determine if Camp-885 and Camp-1149 are the same person and should they be merged. Refer to page 25.
Camp-1149	Deacon Samuel Camp	1635 - 1733	Add the spouses and children for Samuel Refer to page 91.

This is an attempt to clarify some very questionable Wikitree Profiles.

Limitations

Lack of primary sources or quality secondary sources is a problem.

Some of the books quoted are not available in Australia or on the web, and this has hindered any serious research.

There are at least thirteen Profile managers involved in the identified profiles and despite attempts to contact them there has not been any response, or offers of assistance, or input.

A comment from Ann Gulbangi who is the Historian for the Society of Mayflower Descendants in Ohio. Provides an accurate assessment.

"Many of the sources have not been thoroughly documented and some of the data is preliminary, but I'm including it all. I have many primary sources and quality secondary sources, but also lots of Internet sources that range from scholarly to downright conjecture and fantasy. My philosophy is to present it all and then correct and augment as I hear from researchers with better information."



About

There is a report that Edward Campe was christened on 27 Jan 1576 in Nazeing, Essex, England.

The following was taken from the "Parish Registers of Hunsdon in Herts, England 1546-1837" by the Hon. Herbert C. Gibbs, London, 1915:

Marriages: Page 94, Edward Camp to Grace Mott on 21 Sept. 1615

Christenings: Page 114, Edward Camp, Sonne of Edward Camp, 21 Sept. 1617

The following was taken from The Camp Bulletin, The Camp Family Association, Volume VI, #3, September 1985:

"In St. Margarets, near Hunsdon, there is a house still standing that belonged to Edward Campe. In 1628 it was sold to Edward Campe, a blacksmith who went there with his family. He reportedly had his blacksmith shop in the house.

Edward and his wife Grace had three sons: Edward Jr., George and Philemon.

George became a shoemaker and Philemon learned the blacksmith trade by working with his father. Edward emigrated to America.

There are two documents relating to the Campes in the Hertford Record Office both dated 1673.

In one, Edward Campe (Sr.) made over the house and smith shop to Philemon Campe to have after his death. In the meantime, Philemon who was married and had three children was to have the middle chamber and use of the kitchen.

In the other document, George Campe gives to his brother Philemon the right to enter the premises at anytime to repair the House. At that time George seems to be the owner.

Edward Campe died in 1682 and his son, George, died three years later. Philemon became the owner of the house.

He had two sons, Edward and Philemon Jr., who both became blacksmiths.

In 1709 Philemon and his wife leased the house to Thomas Cramphorne for a year. Philemon later gave up blacksmithing when he later sold the property to Mr. Cramphorne.

In 1712 he was reportedly a farmer. In 1719 three of his children were paying to go to the Charity School in Hunsdon so they were still in the village.

There is a story that the Campes became dissenters to the Church at St. Dunstan's Church. This could be the reason that Edward went to America.

There are no records that any of his brothers were baptized."





The first record of him in America is from a court case on Sept 6, 1643 in which he was fined for being late for training.

Edward was a farmer in the section of New Haven called Chestnut Hill. After having been a farmer for a while, he wanted to quit farming and move back into the city. This required approval of the town council, and the town council refused to give him permission to move into town, so he stayed on the farm for the rest of his life.

He did not leave a will and the exact date of his death is not know, but the inventory of his estate which amounted to 100 pounds, 6 shillings, 3 pence, was presented by his widow, Mary Camp, on the first of November. (New Haven Probate Records, I:pt 1,87. New Haven Colonial Records, II:401)

Edward Camp is believed be the son of Edward and Grace (Mott) Camp from Hunsdon in Herts, Essex County, England. Other children of this couple were Grace, George, William, Mary and Philemon.

He is erroneously thought to be the son of Nicholas Camp by several books and researchers.

Edward was born in 1617 and was christened 21 Sep 1617, according to Page 114 of "The Parish Registers of Hunsdon" by Hon. Herbert C. Gibbs, London, 1915. He is not listed as married or buried in England.

It is believed that he is the "Edward Kemp aged 19 yeares" who left England on May 2, 1635, on the ship Alexander which was bound for Barbados under Capt. Burche. There was no mention of a wife. The age of both Edwards match. Information from "Hottons Lists", John Camden Hotten, Pages 73 to 75, 1874.

Edward is first recorded in New Haven, CT on Sept. 6, 1643, when he is fined for being late to training. He took the Oath of Fidelity on July 1, 1644, according to the New Haven Town Records. The Oath of Fidelity was written in 1639 to show allegiance to the Crown in England. acres, be it more or less, which is compassed round with the river and upland." From: "Ancient Town Records, Volume 1" New Haven Colonial Historical Society, edited by Franklin Bowditch Dexter, 1917.

A deposition was given to Capt. Atwood of Milford, CT in 1652 in which he was described as "Edward Camp, aged about 34 yeares." This matches with the birth date for Edward Campe of Nazeing Parish.

In 1655, he and his wife were assigned seats "on ye stile on both sides of the dore in ye meeting house."

In 1656 he was ordered to give one day's work to pay for damages his swine had caused to someone's corn. *Link to Website*

There are a lengthy series of court proceedings that involved Edward as plaintiff and others as defendant. Please refer to the "New Haven Colony History Society, Ancient Town Records, New Haven Town Records" edited by Franklin Bowditch Dexter, Litt. D, 1917.

The proceedings cover theft by Good wife Lines, wife of Ralph Lines, who stole from Edward.

After his death, his wife married John Lane of Milford. The following is from "A Genealogical Dictionary of the First Settlers of NewEngland" by John Savage Page 331: "CAMP, Edward, New Haven1643, had Edward b. 1650, Mary b. 1652, Sarah b. 1655, and perhaps more but not prob. for he d. 1659."

There has been confusion of this Edward l CAMP with another, apparently removed by William F. J. Boardman in *The Ancestry of William Francis Joseph Boardman, Hartford, Connecticut*, Hartford Ct 1906.

See notes under Nicholas (1) & (2) CAMP and their wives.

"The date of his [Edward (1) CAMP] arrival in America is not known, but it was prior to September, 1643; and it is possible that he was the "Edward Kemp, age 19 years," who left England May 2, 1635 on the ship Alexander, bound for "ye Barbadoes," with Capt. Burche and Gilbert Grimes, Mr. This from L John Camden Hatten, *List of Emigrants to America 1600-1700, from the Original Lists of Persons of Quality, p. 73, which also lists a Michell Kimp, age 27.(As late as1850, members of this family were still occasionally recorded as "Kemp.") (P)

Although Edward is thought to have been related to Nicholas Camp, 1st, [see NICHOLAS (1) CAMP, unlinked to Edward in this database] of Milford, no record of him has been found there, and he first appears in New Haven 9/6/1643, when he was fined for being late at the last training.

He took the oath of fidelity 7/1/1644, but was not included in the list of New Haven families in 1641-43. Perhaps he was not head of a family in 1643 when the list was taken. His oldest son was born in 1644-45, so it is possible that his marriage took place after the families were listed. He appears several times in the records of New Haven between 1650 and 1656.

In 1650, he and two others bound themselves for 12 pounds as bail for a seaman who had broken the arm of an Indian named Wash; in 1652, the court ordered him to pay Thomas Beecg twenty shillings, which he refused to do, and Mr.Goodyeare promised to pay it; in 1654, he and several other men were warned to keep their swine out of the Indian corn; the same year he and three others were "complained of for keeping more swine than they are by the order allowed to doe;" in 1655, he and his wife were assigned seats "on ye stile on both sides of the dore (in ye meetinghouse);" and in 1656 he was ordered to give one day's work to pay for the damage the swine had done to someone's corn.(P)

Edward Camp was a farmer and lived in the section of New Haven then called Chestnut Hill. He did not leave a will and the exact date of his death is not known, but the inventory of his estate which amounted to 100 pounds, 6 shillings, 3 pence, was taken 9/22/1659, and was presented by his widow, Mary Camp, on the first of November following (New Haven Probate Records, I:pt 1, 87.New Haven Colonial Records, II:401)."

"EDWARD CAMP, of New Haven, was born in England about 1622, and is believed to have been a relative of Nicholas Camp, 1st, of Milford, Conn.

After his death his family removed, for reasons elsewhere stated, to Milford."



Notes for MARY CANFIELD:

Mary was most likely born in England.

When she married Edward Camp, they lived in New Haven until his death.

She then returned to Milford, CT and married John Lane on April 4, 1666, and lived there until her death in 1680.

"Lane, John, widower of Milford married 4 April 1666 Campe, widow who lived at Chestnut Hill in New Haven Parish by Mr. Treat Majestrat in Milford." (Milford Vital Records)

John Lane diedi n 1669 and in his will mentioned Mary's children, Samuel, Edward Jr., and Mary.

Mary Lane died in 1680; Milford Church Records state "Lane, Mary died Feb. 1680".

An inventory of her will was presented Feb 22, 1680: "The last will and testament of Mary Lane, who being very sicke of body but of sound memory and understanding, doth bequeath as followeth:

I will my body to be decently buried and my soule to God that gave it. Amen.

Item: To my son Samuel Campe, one cow, one ewe & lamb, & one last years lambe.

Item: To my son Edward Camp, my big iron kettle & one three years old steare.

Item: To my daughters Mercy Baldwin and Mary Briscoe, all my wearing clothes (except one black searge coate which I bequeath to my daughter-in-law Sarah Gunn), five pairs of bed sheets, two pillows and two pillow-beers, three pewter platters, three porringer, one quart pott and one pint pott, three napkins, three towells & a table cloth, six yards of new linen cloth, and five shifts with all the rest of my wearing cloaths both linen and woollen & equally to be divided between them.

Item: To my daughter Mehetabell Camp, three silk sheets, one pillow-beer, one little iron kettle & a brass skillett.

Item: To my daughter Mercy aforesd, 2 brass kettles, a two yeare old Heifer, one ram & one swine shoat, one curtaine, one box & one warming pan.

Item: To Mary my daughter aforesd, one little iron pot, one curtaine, and one chest.

Item: To my son Edward aforesd, one tramell & one sow shoate.

Item: To my son-in-law Jobaniah Gun his children, one eye lamb if ye lamb be alive. Item: To my foure children aabovesd, Samuel, Edward, Mercy & Mary, my foure bed blanketts, each of them one.

Finally my bed & bolster I leave to my son Samuel & my daughter Mary equally between them.

I leave Brother Canfield and John Fiske as overseers.

Witnessed by us Thomas Canfield John Fiske her mark Mary Lane (Her mark was the top half of a circle) Taken from "New Haven Probate Records, I: pt 2, 80."



Notes for LT. SAMUEL CAMP, LT:*Samuel Camp was the son of Edward and Mary (Canfield) Camp. He was born in Milford, CT. and lived his entire life there.

Samuel was a mason by trade. In 1697 he was Sergeant in the Second Train Band in Milford. In October 1698 he was officially appointed Lieutenant (of the Band) by the General Court. He used this title often with his name; in fact, he used it on his marriage record three years earlier.

It also help to distinguish him from the other Samuel Camp who was a son of Nicholas Camp.

This Samuel was chosen a Deacon of the church about 1709 and used that title thereafter.

He was one of the proprietors of New Milford but did not move there.

He married (1) Hannah Betts, Daughter of Thomas Betts of Norwalk on 13 Nov. 1672. She was born 12 Nov. 1652 at Guilford and died January 1680.

Samuel married (2) Mary Camp, daughter of William Camp on 10 Oct 1682. She was born in Milford on 22 Mar. 1663 and died in 1691.

He then married (3) Rebecca Atkinson.

In 1691 he was overseer of the estate of Nathaniel Briscoe, husband of his sister, Mary. In a record pertaining to this, he was referred to as "Samuel Camp Senr, her brother." In a deed dated Nov 1, 1715, Samuel Camp of Milford conveyed to his son, Enos, the land which he, Samuel, had bought from his brother, Edward Camp, Jr.

Since there are no Edward Camps coming from the Nicholas Camp lineage, Samuel is know to be the son of Edward Camp.

Samuel's death is documented by his grandson, the Reverend Samuel Camp: "My honored grandfather died Jan 27, 1736, in the 91st year of his age."

Samuel is very clearly documented as the son of Edward Camp in "Camp, Jones and Related Families" by Nell Jones Carter. At the age of 10, Samuel was baptized on 15 Sep 1655

"SAMUEL [CAMP] was born Sept. 15, 1655; he married Mary Camp ...United with the Milford church May 22, 1681.He was one of the proprietors of New Milford, but did not move there, but died in Milford about 1717."

"SAMUEL CAMP, son of Edward and Mary Camp (variously recorded as Lieutenant, Mason, Deacon and Senior), b. 1644-45 at New Haven, Conn., died 1/27/1736 at Milford, Ca on.; (Date of death from Autobiographical Sketch of the Rev. Samuel Camp, grandson of No. 2 [i.e., the present Samuel CAMP], who said: "My honored grandfather died Jan. 27, 1736 in the 91st year of his age.

"He married (1) Hannah Betts, daughter of Thomas Betts of Norwalk, on 11/13/1672. She was born 11/12/1652 at Guilford, and died January, 1680, thus her mother-in-law and her father (who died in 1688) outlived her, which accounts for her not being mentioned in either will.

Samuel married (2) on 10/10/1682, Mary Camp, daughter of William Camp and his wife, Mary Smith, b. Milford, 3/22/1663-4, d. soon after 1691.

He married (3) on 4/28/1695, Rebecca Canfield, widow of Thomas Canfield, 2nd, who died in 1689. She was Rebecca Adkinson (or Atkinson).

It is recorded in the Milford records that: "Rebecca Camp, wife of Deacon Camp, died in Milford, 28 March 1710." She was born ca. 1658.

All three marriages of Samuel Camp are recorded in Milford records.(P) Samuel Camp was a sergeant of the second company trainband in 1697, and was officially appointed Lieutenant by the General Court in October, 1698, although he was referred to as Lieutenant on his marriage record three years earlier.

He was a mason by trade and was called "Mason" in some early records, but he became a deacon of the church about 1709, and thereafter was called by that title, while his son, Samuel, also a mason, became "Samuel Camp, Mason.

"In 1691 he was overseer of the estate of Nathaniel Briscoe, husband of his sister, Mary, and in a record pertaining to this, he was called "Samuel Camp Senr. Her brother."He was a proprietor of New Milford in 1706. (All this from the Milford records.) (P)

Further proof that the Samuel Camp under discussion here was the son of Edward Camp, 1st, of New Haven, can be found in a deed in Milford Land Records, 5:202, dated 11/1/1715, in which Samuel Camp of Milford conveyed to his son Enos, land which he, Samuel, had bought of his brother, Edward Camp.(There were no Edwards in the family of Nicholas Camp.)His sons, Samuel, Enos and Hezekiah, are mentioned in several Milford deeds......

The list of Samuel's children, given below, is from the Camp Charts, the Autobiographical Sketch of the Rev. Samuel Camp, and from *The Ancestry of William Francis Joseph Boardman*, cited elsewhere.*Children of Samuel Camp*, son of Edward Camp, 1st, of New Haven:

SAMUEL, "Mason," b. Milford, 5/20/1675, d. 3/13/1743-4; m. Mary Baldwin ca. 1700. She d. 10/29/1733.

"This review of the early generations in the family of Nicholas Camp, the emigrant [NICHOLAS (1) CAMP of this database], enables us to distinguish between Samuel Camp, son of Nicholas, 2nd [NICHOLAS (2)CAMP of this database], born in 1645, and Samuel Camp, son of Edward,1st, born about 1648, who is the subject of this sketch.

The latter was about eleven years old when his father died, and fourteen when his mother, Mary Camp, married John Lane, as his second wife, and removed to Milford.

The bequests of John Lane to his wife's children indicate that the new home was not an unpleasant one. This step-father died in 1669, giving his widow the life use of his homestead farm.

Samuel Camp was then about twenty-one years of age.(P) No exact date can be assigned to his first grant of land in Milford, but he was doubtless the Samuel Camp who received twelve acres at "Ferry Corner," and a home lot of two acres next east of Josiah Tibbals, of whom as "Samuel Camp Sen'r" he bought land in 1694.(Milford Land Records, I: 89,153; III: 68, 125, 137.) On December 13, 1692, he bought of Joseph Guernsey "a certain house, barn and house lot" of about three roods in Milford, the deed being indexed at the time as that of "Samuel Camp Sen'r."(Ibid. III: 99.)

This was probably his home thereafter.(P) He was a mason by trade, as his son, Samuel, born in 1675, was, and in several instances he was called "mason" before he assumed his military title; but it was his son who came to be known in Milford as "Samuel Camp mason" to distinguish him from others of the name.

The father became "Sergeant" of the second company trainband, certainly in 1697 and perhaps earlier, and apparently served as "Lieutenant" before he was officially appointed by the General Court in October, 1698. In the record of his marriage in 1695 he bears that title, though the record may have been made some time afterward, when the births of his children were recorded.

About 1709, he was also chosen Deacon of the church, and in a deed of December 5, 1710, that was indexed at thetime as that of "Lieutenant Camp," he is called "Samuel Camp Deacon." This title sufficed to distinguish him in the later years of his life.

He is positively identified in 1691 as an overseer of the estate of Nathaniel Briscoe, husband of Mary Camp, daughter if Edward, 1st, as "Samuel Camp Sen'r her brother." He appeared later in that capacity. (Milford Land Records, II: 136; New Haven County Court Records, I:190.] (P) Samuel Camp was one of the proprietors of New Milford in 1706, and in the list is named "Lieutenant Camp," his son Samuel being called "Mason." He did not, however, remove thither, but died in Milford about 1717.

In 1715 he deeded land to his son Enos of Milford, and appears to have been living June 18, 1717, when "Samuel Camp the fourth of Milford" deeded land to his "honored father Samuel Camp of Durham." All that remained of his gravestone in 1889, bore the inscription: "Here lyes buried the body of Deacon Samuel Camp died-----." (Pond's "Inscriptions of Tombstones in Milford," --- *New Haven Historical Society Papers*, Vol. 5.)

An exhaustive search of the Milford records shows that the apparent confusion as to the identity of the various persons named Samuel Camp is due largely to the transfer of the titles "Senior" and "Junior."

Still there was no confusion in the mind of the clerk who used them. From about 1670 to 1676 there was only one of the name who was of age and no distinguishing title was necessary --- he being called simply "Samuel Camp: --- the subject of this sketch.

Later, however, Samuel, son of Nicholas, 2nd, appears, born in 1655, who was called at first "Samuel Camp," but from 1685 to 1694 was called "Samuel Camp Jun'r" the elder being "Samuel Camp. Sen'r."

Then as the latter assumed the military title "Sergeant," and later "Lieutenant," the former was known as simply "Samuel Camp" or "Samuel Camp, Sen'r" to distinguish him from Samuel, the son of Lieutenant

Samuel, who was called "Junior." The latter was in his turn displaced by the appearance of Samuel, the son of Samuel and grandson of Nicholas, 3nd, born in 1683,who became "Junior" or "Samuel Camp the fourth," and the title "mason" was given to the former instead of "Junior."

This procession continued to the great annoyance of modern genealogists, for some years, for Edward 2nd, son of Edward 1st, had a son Samuel, born about 1690, and Samuel, son of Samuel and grandson of Edward, 1st, had a son Samuel, born in 1704, and there were others later.

The Milford records have the following entry: "Samuel Camp of Milford and Hannah Betts of Norwalk were married thirteenth November one thousand six hundred seventy-two, but Mr. Olmstead, Commissioner at Norwalk." This could have been none other than the first marriage of Samuel Camp the son of Edward, 1st. The evidence may be summarized as follows: (1) This Samuel Camp was the only one of marriageable age in Milford, having been born about 1648. (2) The church records have the entry: "1673 Sept 7. Samuel Camp and his wife admitted and he bapt'd on the same day. She buried Jan'y 24, 80. "His baptism is also recorded in the church list.

If we suppose that Samuel, the son of Nicholas, 1st, grew to maturity, he was baptized in September,1645, and Samuel, the son of Nicholas, 2 bd, was baptized May 18, 1662,and both are recorded. The fathers were particular not to baptize the same person twice.(3) Samuel Camp, the son of Samuel Camps and Hannah Betts, born May 23, 1675, is positively identified as the one called "mason," who died March 13, 1743-4 "in his 69th year," and the Milford deeds state that he was the son of "Lieutenant" Samuel, who must therefore have married Hannah Betts.(4)

The death of Hannah Betts Camp, the month before Mary Camp Lane, the mother of Lieutenant Samuel, accounts for the absence of her name in the will of Mrs. Lane, Dated February 22, 1680, when all the others of that family were remembered."(P)

The Milford records give no further information concerning the ancestry of Hannah Betts than her residence; but she was the daughter of Thomas Betts of Norwalk, and was born at Guilford, November 12, 1652. Her father outlived her, dying in 1688, which accounts for the fact that she was not named in his will.(P)

We have also in the Milford town records this marriage: "Samuel Camp & Mary Camp were married the tenth day of Oct'r 1682 by Major Treat." As elsewhere proven Samuel Camp, the son of Edward 1st, could not have married Mercy Scofield as some have claimed, and he alone could have been the person above named.

This is negative evidence it is admitted, but considering all the circumstances it has great weight. It is assumed that the form of the record, according to the manner of such entries in Milford, means that the maiden name of this wife was MARY CAMP, and she was doubtless the daughter of William Camp ... and Mary Smith ..., and was born in Milford, March 22, 1663-4.

She died not long after 1691.(P) The above Samuel Camp is certainly the one referred to in the following records: "Lieu. Samuel Camp, mason, & Rebecca Canfield were married April 28, 1695 by Robert Treat Governor." She was Rebecca Adkinson, the widow of Thomas Canfield, 2nd, who had died in 1689, and of whose estate "Samuel Camp Sen'r" at that time so-called, was one of the overseers.

In a case before the New Haven County Court, March 25, 1703, "Lieu't Samuel Camp, husband to Thomas Canfield, Senior's widow" appeared in behalf of said widow and her children. Thus it happened that Thomas Canfield, 3rd, the son of Rebecca and Mary the daughter of Lieutenant Samuel Camp, who were afterwards married, were associated in the same household in Milford. It is recorded that "Rebecca Camp, wife of Deacon Camp" died in Milford, March 28, 1710-11."

VI. Joel, bap. Feb. 14, 1691, perh. d. May 11, 1713.VII. Abigail, b. March 1, 1696-7.VIII. Hezekiah, b. March 25, 1700.IX. Lemuel, b. Oct. 4, 1701."

"Samuel, son of Nicholas Camp, was born at Milford, September 15,1655. He married, November 13, 1672, Hannah, daughter of Thomas Betts, and lived at Milford. They had a son Nathan, mentioned below [underhis namel."

Thomas Canfield married, February 26, 1679, REBECCA ADKINSON. Of her family nothing is definitely known. It is thought she may have been a daughter of Luke Adkinson (Atkinson, Atkeson, Attconson), who was an early settler in 'New Haven, having a family of four persons in 1643. Luke Adkinson married, 2nd, May 1, 1651, Mary, daughter of Richard Piatt of Milford, and had children, Mary, Hannah, and Sarah, born at New Haven. He removed in 1656 possibly to Middletown, where his widow married, January 3, 1666-7, Thomas Whitmore and died June 1, 1669. Rebecca Adkinson could well have been his daughter and one of the family of four in 1643.

After the death of Mr. Canfield, his widow, Rebecca, April 28, 1695, Samuel Camp, Senior, of Milford, son of Edward Camp 1st of New Haven, by whom also she had children. She died in Milford, March 28, 1710.

SAMUEL CAMP of Milford, Conn., who bore successively the titles "Senior," "Lieutenant," and "Deacon," was born in New Haven about 1648, and was the son of Edward Camp, 1st (No. 164), and Mary, his wife.

The Camp families of Milford present so many and such perplexing genealogical problems that it is necessary, in order to distinguish the above Samuel Camp, to review the entire matter and give the evidence for the positions here taken.

The emigrant ancestor of one Camp family was Nicholas Camp, 1st, who, says Hinman, "came first to Wethersfield," but appears in the list of free planters of Milford, November 20, 1639. In 1646 he was in possession of a homelot of six acres, one rood and twenty poles, located between those of Roger Tyrrell and John Fowler. He also shared in the later divisions of land and bought several tracts.

It has been claimed that "He was the son of John Campe, called the elder, of Nasing, Essex County, England and Mary, his wife. The date of John's marriage appears on the parish records as having taken place in August, 1573. Nicholas, Sr., was born at Nasing in the month of April, 1597. His baptism is recorded the same month." [Boston Evening Transcript, Eebruary 12, 1906.] This statement may well be true, though we have made no investigation of the matter. In the will of Bennett Elliott of Nasing, dated November 5, 1621, proved March 28, 1622, a "Nicholas Campe the younger" is mentioned, and possibly the same who is named in the will of John Campe, the elder, of Nasing, dated May 21, 1630, proved June 11, 1630, as his son, having brothers, George and Thomas, sisters, Mary and Sarah, and grandchildren, Elizabeth and John Campe. In the same will we meet with the name of William Campe, nominated as one of the overseers. [Genealogical Gleanings in England, II: 904-907.] Some writers have stated that William Camp of Milford and Edward Camp. 1st. of New Haven, as well as Nicholas Camp. 2nd. of Milford, were sons of this emigrant ancestor. We know of no evidence in proof of this claim. Edward Camp, 1st, was born in England about 1622, and first appears in New Haven in 1643. It seems more likely that William Camp was a son of the emigrant, if either, though it is quite probable that both were of the Nasing family if Nicholas, 1st, was the son of John Campe of Nasing. Neither William nor Edward appear to have inherited property from Nicholas Camp, 1st, of Milford, although William was living in Milford at the time when the emigrant is supposed to have died.

In 1645 the first name of the wife of Nicholas Camp, 1st, was Sarah. She is assumed to have been his first wife. Her family name is unknown. She was doubtless the mother of the child " Sarah Camp dau. of Nicholas Camp," baptized March 19, 1643, in her father's right, as " Sarah wife of bro. Camp" did not become a member of the church until August 4, 1644. Some genealogists assert also that in addition to the son, William, there were older daughters of Nicholas, 1st, Abigail, the wife of Nathan Baldwin, who died March 22, 1647, and Mary, the wife of John Baldwin. Opposite the above entry is the following note: " She died in childbed Sept. 6, 1645, being the last day of the week in the morning and was buried in the evening in my garden having been well delivered of two sons upon the second day of same month and very well as could be expected till the second day in the night, when she began to be very ill having taken cold in the morning before." In the church record of baptisms is the entry: "1645 Sept. Samuel and John sons of Brot^. Camp twins." A copy of these records made by E. R. Lambert gives this appended note from the original: "Samuel died at nurse at Sister Fenn's in the night suddenly." Another version has it: "They died at nurse at Sister Fenn's Nov. 22 in the night 1645, suddenly." In any case Samuel Camp, the son of Nicholas, 1st, born September 2, 1645, died young. There is no record of the birth of another Samuel in this family and we have found no evidence whatsoever in the Milford records that a son of that name grew to maturity.



[Winthrop's History of New England, 1853, p. 238; Stiles's History of Windsor, I: 67, 167.]

By this wife Nicholas Camp, 1st, had a daughter, Abigail, baptized in Milford, August 29, 1647.

In the town records of New Haven is the following entry: "Nicolas Campe of Milford and Kattern Tompson of New Haven widdow were married by the Governer the 14th of July 1652." This has been supposed by some to be the record of the first marriage of Nicholas Camp, 2nd, of Milford, son of the emigrant, who was born in 1630. It doubtless corresponds nearly with the date of his marriage; but his wife in 1681 is proven to have been a sister of Jeremiah Beard, deceased. Anthony Tompson died May 23, 1647, having then a son Anthony who took the oath of fidelity May 2, 1654, and died the same year on the 26th of December. He married his second wife, Kattern (Katherine), in 15? BOARDMAN ANCESTRY. 1644, and by her had three children. Therefore, unless she was very much younger than her husband, Anthony Tompson, and very much older than Nicholas Camp, 2nd, the above record must be that of the third marriage of Nicholas Camp, 1st, the emigrant, a conclusion supported by other circumstances. The death of Nicholas Camp, 1st, is believed to have occurred not long before 1658, when a "Widow Camp" of New Haven gave to her daughter, Bridget Tompson, a portion due her from the estate of her fatlier, Anthony Tompson. Only one of that name is found in the list of freemen in 1669, who was tlie son. The practice in the Milford records had been to distinguish tliem by tlie titles "Senior" and "Junior," but the return made by the searchers for Whalley and Goffe, May 20, 1661, has the signature of "Nicholas Campe" without any such title [New Haven Colonial Records, II: 389n.] The same is true of a deed to Nicholas Campe and John Beard, September 16, 1664, and in this case the son, who was at other times associated with his brother-inlaw in land transactions, was undoubtedly the person named. [Milford Land Records, IV: 294; cf. IV: 329.] The only male representative of this family in the second generation, as far as proven by the records we have seen, was Nicholas Camp, 2nd. It is recorded that "Nicholas Camp, Jun'. hath given him by his father Nicholas Camp, Sen^ one House Lott containing by estimation, one Acre & halfe & twenty Poles be it more or less, bounded with a highway west, with Nicholas Camp Sen"", to the north, with other Letts East, and with Joseph Baldwin South." [Milford Land Records, 1:104.]

In October of 1681, William Camp was one of the persons who inventoried the estate of Martin Tichanor of Newark and was named as an "overseer" of the estate. He also witnessed the will of Joseph Riggs of Newark, dated January 1, 1688/89. In November of 1689, he was a overseer of the estate of John Baldwin of Newark. He held various town offices between 1670 and 1696, one of which in 1693 was "Overseer of the Poor".


