Item. I give unto my son Benjamin Dorsey and his heirs for ever one hundred Acres of land called long Reach boeing part of saide Tract which containes fower hundred forty Eight Acres with two silver spoons the littell Gun to be delivered him att the age of sixteen yeeres. Item. I give unto my son John Dorsey one hundred forty Eight Acres of land boeing the remain<sup>ing</sup> part of the land called long Reach to him and his heirs for ever one new Gun two silver spoons to be delivered him att the age of sixteen. Item. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Petticoate one of my large silver cups. Item. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Hannah Howards thros Children twenty shillings to each Child. Item. I give and bequeath unto my deere and well belovede wife Margrett Dorsey and to her heirs for ever all the remaining part of my Estate both Real and personall where ever the same shall be found and I doe nominate and appoints her my saide lovinge wife to be whole and Sole Executrix of this my last will and Testament here by Revoking disanulling and making voyde all Wills heretofore by me made and declaring this to be my last will and Testament.
