

Marriages at Old Biloxi and New Orleans- the Baleine brides and some more who were not on “the list” from 4 February 1721 to 21 August 1722

La Baleine anchored off the Gulf Coast near Mobile Bay on 8 January 1721. Bienville wrote on 25 April 1721 that **88** girls arrived on *La Baleine* and **19** had been married off since the 4th of March. Two other boats had also brought women- *Le Chameau* and *La Mutine*. There were still **59** women to be taken care of. On **25 June 1721** Bienville wrote that **31** girls had been married off between 24 April and 25 June 1721 – all from *la Baleine*. [Initial list taken from Rootsweb, Lastland-L Archives, Bryant W. Denise Aleaume [Alihome/Alio/Aliome] *dite* **Voillot**, age 18, daughter of Jacques and Jeanne Segure, married at Old Biloxi **Jacques Bernard dit St. Jacques, 22 June 1721**. She was deceased by June 1730 - considered living in Illinois. [SLC (St. Louis Cathedral), M1, 33, p. 2] [He was the son of Jacques and Françoise Splonzin/Plonzain; witnesses: **Pierre Derouche; Raimond Broce** (Brosse?); **Charles Goubin.**]

Jacques Bernard was a native of the Diocese of Nantes, resident of Illinois in 1730; buried 9 October 1731, said to be a native of Ancenis, Diocese of Nantes [SLC, B1, 71, p. 18].

Jacques Bernard called St. Jacques – son of Jacques Bernard and Françoise Splonzin, married, 22 June 1721, **Denise Alio** –daughter of Jacques Alio and Jeanne Segure. [The bride signed “**Denis Alihome.**”] Place of marriage not specified. [NO French, 9]

Jacques Bernard – resident of Illinois, native of the bishopric of Nantes, son of Jacques Bernard and François Plonzard, widower of **Lorine Eliaume** [*sic*], who died in Illinois, married 19 June 1730, Renée Salahun – native of the bishopric of Vannes, daughter of Nicolas Salahun and Perine Lorhaut. Place of marriage not specified. [NO French, 10]

Jacques Bernard, son of Jacques Bernard and Françoise Plonzain, native of the diocese of Nantes, resident of the Illinois, widower of **Louise Eliavane**, deceased at Illinoux, married Renée Salahun, 19 June 1730; witnesses: Louis Riche, commercial traveller; Joseph Verrier; Louis Modran; Pierre Vlin; St. Germain; Lazou [SLC, M1, 210, p. 18]. Marie Anne Bernard, daughter of Jacques Bernard and Renaude Salahun was baptized 9 March 1731, New Orleans; godparents: Claude Renault, sergeant, and Anne Françoise Treponet [SLC, B1, 3, p. 18].

Jacques Bernard *dit* St. Bernard was in Kaskaskia *circa* 1726/1727.

“Cases that no doubt cause much gossip were paternity cases.... In another case, **Jacques Bernard dit St. Jacques** came before the judge to request that Pierre Hullin claim and support the child born to Bernard’s wife conceived during Bernard’s absence on a voyage. Voyages might last four to six months, and Mme Bernard may have been lonely. The amount of damages is not given in the document preserved.” Dean and Brown, 1981, 26:5:23:1, 25:12:1:1. in Brown – *History As They Lived It*.

Beauregard, tome II – p. 211 – census 1 January 1726 – Illinois
St-Jacques (Bernard, Jacques dit), his wife, one child

Beauregard – p. 233 “**Bernard dit St-Jacques**, un enfant naturel, né de la femme de Jacques Bernard dit St-Jacques avec Poerre Hulin. L’enfant est né durant l’absence du mari et a été enregistré sous le nom de ce dernier. A son retour il produit une requête réclamant une pension à Pierre Hulin pour l’entretien de l’enfant, en date du 23 May 1726.” [Date of birth not given- is this the same child as shown in the January 1726 census?] The unnamed wife must be **Denise Aleaume**.

Witnesses at marriage:

Raimond Broce – maybe same as Raymond Brosse in Kaskaskia?? If so, Raymond Brosse and Françoise Rabut were godparents to an unnamed daughter of Antoine Sorel and Lucie Rollet, born 11 April 1726 at Fort de Chartres [Chartres, 18]. Raymond Brosse/Brosse *dit Berre/ Berne* was on the Duchesse de Noailles, 23 May 1718 from La Rochelle to Louisiana. François La Ferrière was on the same ship [Conrad, I, 15; Toups, 30]. June 27, 1744 Raimond Brosse dit St. Cerny, habitant in city of Cas [Kaskaskia], parish of Immaculate Conception, was ready to leave for New Orleans and made out his will. Left money to the church, to his goddaughter, Agnès Hulin, and his good friend, Jean Henry dit Larose. [Kaskaskia Manuscripts and Belting, p. 88]

Charles Goubin, a workman, single, in New Orleans, Rue de Bourbon in 1 January 1726 census of Louisiana [Census, 72]

Pierre Dirouche, at old Biloxi, married **Catherine Delaunay**, 24 February 1721 [SLC, M1, 12] [Pierre Dirouche was the son of Christophe and Jeanne Cologne; witnesses: Jacques Galibert; **Claude Pierre Marechal**; **Raimond Brosse**] Went to Kaskaskia with wife. Known as Pierre Dirouche *dit Laverdure*.

[Not on list.](#) **Marie Catherine Augrand**, daughter of Nicolas and Elisabeth Flar, married at Old Biloxi **Robert Blanquet**, 16 April 1721 [SLC, M1, 18] [Robert Blanquet was the son of Michel and Marie Hosas; witnesses: **Rene Dubo**; **Etienne Couvant**; **Pierre Julien**; **Pierre Sebastien D’Arto** (Lartaud?); Etienne Braquigny] Marie **Marguerite Augrand**, daughter of Michel, Master Mason at Dieppe, Diocese of Rouen, and Elizabeth A[h/l]ard, widow of Robert Blanquette, married **Jean Pierre Morel**, at la Balize downstream of the Mississippi River, 28 May 1725 [SLC, M1, 95]

Nicolas Augrand, native of Dieppe in Normandy, master mason, contractor for the Company [of the Indies], 63 years old, buried 10 October 1724 [AN, F 1724-25, 46]

Robert Blanquet – son of Michel Blanquet and Marie Hosas, married **Marie Catherine Augrand** – daughter of Nicolas Augrand and Elisabeth Flar (?), 16 April 1721. Place not specified. [NO French, 11]

Jean Pierre Morel – menuissier, son of Pierre Moel, master menuissier in Parish, parish of St. Nicolas du Chardonnet, and Renée Baudin, married 28 May 1725, Balize Island, **Marie Marguerite Angrand** [or Augrand] – widow of Robert Blanquette, daughter of Michel Angrand, master mason at Dieppe, parish of St. Remy, bishopric of Rhouan, and Elizabeth Alard. [NO French, 74]

Census of Colony of Louisiana, 1 January 1726 **Pierre Morel and wife** listed as habitants of Mobile [Census, 64] **Pierre Morel**, a joiner, was listed as single in the November 24, 1721 census- in New Orleans in the service of the Company [Census, 19]

Toups, p. 102- Le Chameau, 11 August 1720, Capt. M. Fouquet. On board was Robert Blanquet, a chandelier

Conrad, I- p. 213 9 December 1721- List of company workers who were actually in Louisiana

Étienne Couvent, a founder, good worker

p. 214- Nicolas Augrand (master mason) and Michel Augrand (journeyman mason)

p. 215 Robert Blanquet, candlemaker – passable

p. 215 René Dubos, “Gazonneur” – passable

p. 215 Pierre Julien, “Gazonneur” - passable

Catherine Bady/Badi, age 20, daughter of Brie and Louise Arbour, married **Nicolas Lepreux dit Montreuil**, **23 April 1721** [SLC, M1, 19] [Son of Claude and Jeanne Oudar; witnesses: Pierre Faugere; **Louis Robillard**; François Dubois; **Jacques Duval**; Catherine Audar]

Nicolas Le Preux [or Le Pieux] called Montreuil – son of Claude Le Preu and Jeanne Oudar, married **Catherine Badi** – daughter of Brie Bady and Louise Arbour, 23 April 1721. Place not specified. [NO French, 64]

Witnesses:

Louis Robillard -15 May 1721 married Marie Magdeleine Cordie [Baleine woman]; [Census, 58] **Robillard and wife**, listed as habitants of Illinois, 1 January 1726; [Census, 152] – **Robillard and wife**, listed 1 January 1732 in the prairie of Fort Chartres of Illinois.

François Dubois- possibly François Dubois, native of Daubord near Rochefort, master cooper, 62 years, buried 3 September 1725 [AN, F 1725, 25 – SLC, 86] **or** Conrad, I, p. 68 – 12 September 1719, *Duchesse de Noailles*, a soldier, François Dubois, from Bayonne, parish of St. Louis, age 20.

Catherine Audar- on “the Two Brothers” which sailed 19 August 1719 from France to Louisiana. She was listed as Catherine Oudart, age 33, from Paris, sent from Rochefort by a council; [Census, 88] – Catherine Ondar [Oudar], wife of deceased Beaulieu, a sergeant.

Not on list and most likely no connection to Baleine but some of same witnesses attended the wedding – Marie Baudoin, widow of Pierre Marioche, married **Louis Bret**, **16 August 1721** [SLC, M1, 41] [Louis Bret, widower of Elizabeth Rouet; witnesses: **Sebastien Lartaud**; Antoine Micou; **Etienne Girault**, Jacques Salo]

Louis Bret – widower of Elizabeth Rouet, married **Marie Baudouin**, widow of Pierre Marioche, 16 August 1721. No place specified. [NO French, 16]

Marguerite Beganies/Beguine, age 15, daughter of Jean Baptiste and Marguerite Fouverene, married at Old Biloxi **Antoine Negrier**, **4 June 1721** [SLC, M1, 27] [He was the son of François and Marie Burelle; witnesses: **Jean Caron**; **Jacques Coquelin** [dit] La Forme, deceased in 1728, husband of Jeanne Bourgeois]; Pierre Brie; Pierre Aurion; Jean Samuel Larieux; Seguin] She was deceased by 10 March 1737 when Antoine Negrier married Madeleine Rouget/Roget/Rouger/Rouge, daughter of Mathieu Rouger and Simone Servon in Mobile. He was said to be an employee of the Governor in New Orleans. They appeared to be the parents of four children. The family moved to Plaquemines Parish between 1758 and 1765.

Antoine Negrier – son of François Negrier and Marie Burelle, married **Marguerite Beguine**-daughter of Jean Baptiste Beguiné and Marguerite Souverene, 4 June 1721. No place specified. [NO French, 76]

“On 18 December **1736**, I, a Capuchin Priest, baptized with the ordinary ceremonies of the Church a natural daughter of **Magdelaine Roger**, who stated that the father was **Antoine Negrier**, Patron. Godparents were Nicolas Aubron and Marie Anne Hupé, who gave her the name of Anne Magdelaine...” [Mobile, 320].

1 January **1726**, Census of Louisiana, New Orleans, rue de Bourbon, **Antoine Negrier and wife** [Census, 73]

[Census, 88] – **Antoine Nogrien, wife**, *rue de Bourbon*, July **1727** census –near Jacques Coquelin and family.

Negrier listed on **1731** Gonichon map as land owner of New Orleans [Census, 112] – near Lartean and Hupe

Negrier listed with a wife in January **1732** census of New Orleans on *rue d’Orleans*. Said to be a former foreman. One Negro slave [Census, 139]

Witnesses at marriage:

Jean Caron, a baker, husband of **Anne Moni**, 20 March 1721.

Jacques Coquelin dit LaForme- husband of Jeanne Bourgeois; son of Estienne Coquelin and Marie de la [forme?], native of Vitre in Brittany, diocese of Rennes, soldier, buried 1 January **1728** [An, F1727-1728, 44- SLC, 55]. In 1 January **1726** census of Louisiana, on rue de Bourbon, with a **wife and child** [Census, 72] [Census, 88, **Jacques Coquelin, wife, child, in July 1727** census on *rue de Bourbon*. [Mobile, 88] Marie Coquelin, daughter of **Jacques Coquelin** and Marie Bourgeois, was baptized 5 April **1720**, born 28 March 1720.

Marguerite Belanger, age 26, daughter of Jacques and Catherine Garboise, native of Sèvres, Archdiocese of Paris, married at Old Biloxi (1) **Joseph Dutro/Duero**, **6 May 1721** [SLC, M1, 24]. He was deceased at Natchez. [Joseph Dutro/Duero was the son of Jean Baptiste and Marguerite Descros; witnesses: Louis Ducoudre; Michel Chouquet; **Catherine de St. Paul**]; (2) **Jean Baptiste Robalay**, 12 January 1733 [SLC, B1, 59].

Joseph Dubro – son of Jean Baptiste Dubro and Marguerite Descros, married **Marguerite Belanger** – daughter of Jacques Belanger and Catherine Garboise, 6 May 1721. Place not specified. [NO French, 37]

Jean Baptiste Rabalay, resident of Pointe Coupée, native of Rochefoucault in Poitou, son of Jean Baptiste Rabalay and Marie Marguerite Descros, married **Marguerite Belanger**, native of Suire (?), archbishopric of Paris, widow of Joseph Ducro, who died at Natchez [NO French, 83].

Not on list - Marie Françoise Bienvenu, daughter of Philippe and Françoise Cla[ir] [Allaire], married at Old Biloxi **François LaFerièr dit Bouillie/Bouillier, 16 March 1721** [SLC, M1, 14] [François LeFerièr dit Bouillie was the son of François Bouillie and Marguerite Rousseau; witnesses: Jean Freeino; **Claude Fortier**; André Guentel; **Jean Beranger**; Marc Poirier; **Jeanne Bienvenu**, the bride's sister; **Etienne Giraud**] Based on the June 1723 inventory by Philippe Bienvenu in Kaskaskia, Marie Françoise was said to be "Madame Maladette, living on the coast."

François La Ferrière called Bouillie – son of François Bouillie and Marguerite Rousseau, married **Marie Françoise Bienvenu** – daughter of Philippe Bienvenu and Francois Clair [Françoise Allaire (me)], 16 March 1721. Place not specified. [NO French, 56]

Françoise Bienvenu was born 22 September 1703 and baptized 23 September 1701, Ploemeur, from Lorient.

François La Ferrière was one of the party at the officers's mess from 29 March 1718 to 16 May 1718 (49 days) awaiting departure on the *Duchesse de Noailles*, 25 May 1718, captain M. La Salle [Conrad, I, 4]. He was part of the Charles Scourion de la Houssaye Concession [Conrad, I, p.12]. [Toups, p. 29] a worker of Sr La Houssaye- François Ferrière from Mans.

Probably of no connection but a François Boulter was a godparent to François Boudignon, 29 May 1749 [SLC, p. 29].

Estienne Girault and child were enumerated in the census of New Orleans, 1 July 1727, as *habitants* of La Balise, the fort at the mouth of the Mississippi River [Census, 95]. **Giraud**, a joiner, was listed with a **wife and child** on rue Royale, January 1732 [Census, 130]. **Giraud**, a joiner, was listed as living on the land of Chauvin de la Fresnière, native of Canada, in the 20 December 1724 census of habitants along the Mississippi River from New Orleans to Ouacha or the German Villages [Census, 44]. **Etienne Girault/Giraud**, son of Bertrand and Catherine Hemoy, joiner, native of Oleron (Ile d'Oleron), Diocese of Saintes, married **Catherine Hulvoy**, 25 November 1728; witnesses: **Jean Caron**, resident of New Orleans; Louis Dujot; Nicolas Fisau/Fiseau; François Chatel; George Cappe; Louis Filior; **Anne Mony**; Antoine Joseph Delattre (SLC, M1, 167)]. **Catherine Hulvoy** was the daughter of Gilles and Jacqueline Legourlay, native of Lorient, Diocese of Vannes, widow of Michel Bonpais. **Etienne Giraud**, son of Bertrand and Catherine Hemoy, native of Ile d'Olerons, Diocese of Saintes, was buried 20 October 1733 [SLC, B1, 85]. An Etienne Giraud, son of Bertrand and Catherine Hemoy, native of Ile d'Oleron, diocese of Saintes, was buried 20 October 1733 in New Orleans. Catherine Aimé, wife of Etienne Girau, a joiner, was buried 9 October 1724 in New Orleans [AN, F1724-1725, 44].

André Quenetel, from Rouen, was part of the de la Houssaye concession with Françoise La Ferrière [Conrad, I, p. 12].

Claude Fortier witness to several marriages.

Geneviève Billard, age 17, daughter of Pierre and Jeanne Cadet, married at Old Biloxi **Pierre Santorin**, **23 April 1721** [SLC, M1, 20] [He was the son of Antoine and Marie Françoise ??; witnesses: Carrière, Tessier]

Pierre Santorin – son of Antoine Santorin and Marie Françoise, married **Geneviève Billard** – daughter of Pierre Billard and Jeanne Cadet, 23 April 1721. Place not specified. [NO French, 93]

[Toups, p. 97] **Pitre Santorin**, a couvreur, was on *la Seine*, 11 August 1720, Captain M. Le Blanc. He was going to the Concession of M. Le Blanc and M. Le Marquis Dasfeld.

Catherine Blanchard, age 18, daughter of Pierre and ?, married at Old Biloxi **Mathurin Roger**, **5 April 1721** [SLC, M1, 18, p. 226] [Mathurin Roger was the son of Pierre and Jeanne Hersane; witnesses: **Jean Bidet**; **Jacques Valade**; **Etienne Girod (Giraud?)**; **Jean Harleu**] Their son, Jean Francois, was buried 11 January 1724 [SLC- AN, F 1724-1725, 41, p. 226]

Mathurin Roger – son of Pierre Roger and Jeanne Hervane (?), married, 5 April 1721, **Catherine Blanchard** – daughter of Pierre Blanchard. The mother is not given. Place not specified. [NO French, 90]

Witnesses:

Jean Bidet- was on *le St. Louis* from the rade of La Palisse for Louisiana 21 March 1719. He was a wheelwright going to work on the Concession of Cantillon. He was with **Sebastien Lartout**, a tailor. [Toups, p. 42, says the date was 17 March 1719]

Jacques Valade, son of Mathurin Valade and Elisabeth Dolette, was from La Rochelle. He married at Old Biloxi **Marthe Burelle**, 10 February 1720 [1721?] She had to be one of the Baleine girls because the witnesses were Dalcour and Sister Gertrude [SLC, M1, 10] - SLC, 252.

Estienne Girault and child were enumerated in the census of New Orleans, 1 July 1727, as *habitants* of La Balise, the fort at the mouth of the Mississippi River [Census, 95]. **Giraud**, a joiner, was listed with a **wife and child** on rue Royale, January 1732 [Census, 130]. **Giraud**, a joiner, was listed as living on the land of Chauvin de la Fresnière, native of Canada, in the 20 December 1724 census of habitants along the Mississippi River from New Orleans to Ouacha or the German Villages[Census, 44]. **Etienne Girault/Giraud**, son of Bertrand and Catherine Hemoy, joiner, native of Oleron (Ile d'Oleron), Diocese of Saintes, married **Catherine Hulvoy**, 25 November 1728; witnesses: **Jean Caron**, resident of New Orleans; Louis Dujot; Nicolas Fisau/Fiseau; François Chatel; George Cappe; Louis Filior; **Anne Mony**; Antoine Joseph Delattre (SLC, M1, 167)]. **Catherine Hulvoy** was the daughter of Gilles and Jacqueline Legourlay, native of Lorient, Diocese of Vannes, widow of Michel Bonpais. **Etienne Giraud**, son of Bertrand and Catherine Hemey, native of Ile d'Olerons, Diocese of Saintes, was buried 20 October 1733 [SLC, B1, 85].

Toups, p. 2 – **Mathurin Roger**- 25 October 1717- on either *le Neptune*, *La Dauphine* (Beranger was the captain) or *la Vigilente*. He was an illegal salt dealer.

Marie Bled, age 20, on list, but there was a **Françoise Bled/Blee**, daughter of Jean Baptiste and Marie Thérèse Marencour, native of Paris, widow of **Louis Pousset**, deceased at Natchez, who married **Pierre Le Sage**, 12 April 1730 [SLC, M1, 191]. [Pierre LeSage, son of ? and Elizabeth Callerien; witnesses: Jean Baptiste Guillon; Joseph La Roche; Thomas Asselin; Louis Druillon/Drouillon; Pierre Messenger; Charles Richard; Jacques Bigot] – This record does not state where she was from.

Marie Jeanne/Nanette/Anne Blegnot/Bleignot/Blequot, age 17, daughter of Charles and Marie François Duero/Duerve, native of Gilien, Diocese of Orléans, married (1) at Old Biloxi **Jacques Keston/Castan**, **5 June 1721** [SLC, M1, 28]; (2) **Laurent Cheverly**, 15 May 1727 [SLC, M1, 128] [Jacques Keston/Castan was the son of Antoine and Anne ??; witnesses: **Pierre Sebastien Lartaud; Joseph Lefruglais; Louis Begnon**]

Jacques Keston – son of Antoine Keston and Anne [Blank], married **Marie Jeanne Blequot** – daughter of Charles Blequot and Marie Françoise Ducro, 5 June 1721. Place not specified. [NO French, 55]

Laurent Cheurity – native of Vierge (?) Le François, diocese of Chalons-sur-Marne, son of Jacques Cheurity and deceased Jeanne Morlay, soldier in the Company of Mr. Mandeville, married **Anne Bleignot** – native of Gilien, diocese of Orleans, daughter of deceased Charles Bleignot and Marie Ducroe, widow of Jacques Castan, 15 May 1727. Place not specified. [NO French, 23]

Laurent Cheverly, son of Jacques and deceased Jeanne Morlay, native of Vitry-le-François, Diocese of Chalons-sur-Marne, soldier in the company of Mandeville; witnesses: Mathieu Menerol/Menerolle, locksmith; Joseph Langlois, locksmith; Philippe Le Duc; Nicolas Brantan/Brantant, resident of parish in New Orleans [SLC, M1, 128] [SLC, 51]

Witnesses at marriage with Castan:

Pierre Sebastien Lartaud, a tailor, was on *le St. Louis* from the *rade* of La Palissade, 21 March 1719 going to the Concession of Cantillon. Jean Bidet was with him. Lartaud married at Old Biloxi **Louise Benedi[c?] Le Fel**, a Baleine girl, 28 April 1721. His witnesses were Jacques Valade, Antoine Nicou [Micou??], Jean Bidet, Pierre Blanchet and Jean Galibert. Lartaud, after the death of Louise Benedict Tefel, in New Orleans, married Marie Roussaud/Rousseau, 1 November 1728. [SLC, 153] Lartaud, a tailor from La Rochelle was killed at Natchez [Beauregard, 316; Census, 105]. L'Arteau was listed as a property owner on the map by Gonichon in 1731 [Census, 112]

Joseph Lefruglais/Fouguelay- witness at several marriages – Conrad, I, p. 45- 28 May 1719, *l'Union*, with the Pontval Party- **Joseph** and **Jean de Frusquelay**, workers

Louis Begnon, son of François and Mathurine Guinarde, married at Old Biloxi **Elizabeth Delaunay** [a Baleine girl], 19 May 1721; witnesses: Jean Bidet, Guillaume Fauché, Joseph Lefruglais/Fouguelay, Sebastien Lartaud/Lartaud, Jean Cartier, Antoine Caron, J. Galibert.

Agnes Bloy, age 18, on list, but there was a **Louise Blois**, daughter of Pierre and Agnes (J?)ucad, married at Old Biloxi, **Honoré Lambert**, **11 August 1721** [SLC, M1, 39] [He was the son of Barthelemy and Catherine Solas; witnesses: **Jacques Valade; Jean Bidet; Mathurin Boyer**]

Honoré Lambert – son of Barthelemy Lambert and Catherine Solas, married **Louise Blois**- daughter of Pierre Blois and Agnes Lucad (??), 11 August 1721. No place specified. [NO French, 57]

In the 1 January **1726** census of the Louisiana Colony, **Honoré Lambert and wife** were enumerated on *rue d'Orléans* [Census, 76]. In the **1727** census of New Orleans, **Lambert, a foreman, wife and child** were enumerated on *rue d'Orléans* [Census, 93].

Marie Bocquet/Boquet, age 22, daughter of Jean and Denise Charlemagne, married at Old Biloxi **Vivien/Vien Bailly**, **21 June 1721** [SLC, M1, 33] [He was the son of Julien and ??; witnesses: Louis Simonet; **Antoine Negrier**; **Honoré Lambert**; **Joseph Lefruglais**; **Marie Claude Lemoine**]

Vivien Bailly – son of Julien Bailly and [blank], married **Marie Boquet**, daughter of Jean Boquet and Denise Charlemagne, 25 June 1721. Place of marriage not specified. [NO French, 5]

In the 1 July **1727** census of New Orleans **Vivien Bailly, sailmaker, wife and child** were enumerated on *rue St. Pierre* [Census, 92]. They were not enumerated there in the 1726 census.

[Conrad, II, p. 119] **Vivien Bailly** buried 20 September 1728 [New Orleans?]. A sailmaker for the Company. Native of the parish of St- Jean-d'Angély, diocese of Sainte. Aged about 38 years.

Witnesses at marriage:

Antoine Negrier, son of François and Marie Burelle, married **Marguerite Beganies/Beguine**, age 15, daughter of Jean Baptiste and Marguerite Fouverene, at Old Biloxi, **4 June 1721** [SLC, M1, 27] ; witnesses: **Jean Caron**; **Jacques Coquelin** [*dit* La Forme, deceased in 1728, husband of Jeanne Bourgeois]; Pierre Brie; Pierre Aurion; Jean Samuel Larieux; Seguin] She was deceased by 10 March 1737 when Antoine Negrier married Madeleine Rouget/Roget/Rouger/Rouge, daughter of Mathieu Rouger and Simone Servon in Mobile. In the 1 January **1726** census of the Louisiana Colony, **Honoré Lambert and wife** were enumerated on *rue d'Orléans* [Census, 76]. In the **1727** census of New Orleans, **Lambert, a foreman, wife and child** were enumerated on *rue d'Orléans* [Census, 93].

Joseph Lefruglais/Fouguelay- witness at several marriages [Conrad, I, p. 45] 28 May 1719, *l'Union*, with the Pontval Party- **Joseph** and Jean **de Frusquelay**, workers

Marie Claude Lemoine – A **Marie Lemoine** married Jacques Larchevesque at Old Biloxi, 5 February 1721 [SLC, M1, 10] Witness was C.C. Dutisne.

Not on list and most likely not part of any group – Charlotte Catherine Boiron, daughter of deceased Étienne Boiron, lieutenant in the Duzan Regiment, and Heleine Catherine Vondrek, married **Jean de Bry de Brosse/Desbrosse, 25 February 1721** [SLC, M1, 12] [Jean de Bry de Brosse, son of Emanuel De Bry, royal magistrate for finances in the city of Lion [Lyons?] and Antoinette Molenchon; witnesses: Chartier de Baulne; Rossard; Gauvery; Marin; Berard; Catherine Vondrebek – location not specified]

Jean De Bry – son of Mr. Manuel de Bry, procureur du Roy en l’Election de la Vale de Lion and Dame Antoinelle (*sic*) Motenchon (?), married **Charlotte Catherine Boiron** – daughter of deceased Etienne Boiron, lieutenant in Duzan’s regiment, and Helene Catherine Vondrebek, 25 February 1721, Old Biloxi. [NO French, 29]

Madeleine Boulogne, age, 19, daughter of Pierre and Jeanne Tessier, married at Old Biloxi **Pierre de Vauvray/Vaubray, 4 April 1721** [SLC, M1, 17] [He was the son of Jean and Françoise Jeofournai; witnesses: Bernard Biron; Jean Dartiguiere; **Sister Gertrude**; **Sister St. Louis**; **Sister Marie**] *They really liked this couple or they really wanted her married!*

Pierre de Vauvray – son of Jean de Vauvray and Françoise Jeofournais (?), married **Magdelaine Boulogne** – daughter of Pierre Boulogne and Jeanne Tessier, 4 April 1721. No place specified. [NO French, 33]

In the 1 July 1727 census of New Orleans, **Magdelaine Boulanger, wife of Vauvray, and a child** were enumerated on *rue de Conti* [Census, 90]

Geneviève Boyer, age 25 [no information on her found to date]

24 Novembre 1724 – New Orleans, forced immigrants (women) Marie Boyer, single [Census, 21]

Hélène Brière, age 14 [no information on her found to date]

Marthe Burel/Burelle, age 21, married at Old Biloxi **Jacques Valade, 10 February 1720** [SLC, M1, 10] [This is one year before the marriages of the women from *La Baleine*. An error in year (?) because one of the witnesses was **Sister Gertrude**.] [He was the son of Mathurin and Elisabeth Dolette, of La Rochelle; witnesses: **Dalcour**; **Sister Gertrude**]

Jacques Valade – native of La Rochelle, son of Mathurin Valade and Elizabeth Dolette, married **Marthe Burelle/Bunelle**, 10 February 1721. No place specified. [NO French, 98]

Dalcour – **Estienne Dalcour**, son of [?] attorney at the High Court, and Catherine Godefroy, of Bordeaux, married Marie Josephe Trudeau, daughter of François Trudeau and Jeanne Burelle, 30 may 1723; witnesses: Genevieve Burelle; Marguerite Trepagnier; de Croustilha [SLC, M1, 64]. He and his wife were enumerated in the censuses of New Orleans [Census, 32 (Fort Louis, Biloxi, cashier of Company-1722); 34- 1723 former cashier of company; 37 – 1723 Cashier; 56, 1726- along Mississippi with wife and child; 78 – 1726 in New Orleans requesting a Negro; 98- 1727 on right bank along the Mississippi near New Orleans- le sieur Dalcourt, wife, 2 children; 115- 1731- along the Mississippi- sieur Dalcourt, wife, 6 children, and Mademoiselle Milon; 142, 144- 1731- owned property along Mississippi near New Orleans.

Sister Gertrude – Head nun who accompanied the women on *la Baleine* in 1721.

Marie Anne Charlotte/Charlotte, Charlot, age 20, daughter of Jean and Elizabeth Laferre, married at Old Biloxi **François Hupé**, of Paris, **16 June 1721** [SLC, M1, 31] Strange entry- seems he married **Anne Lange**, 16 August 1721 (in New Orleans??) [SLC, M1, 40] [François Hupé was the son of Jean and Anne/Jeanne Hubert/Humbert; witnesses: **Marie Daudain**; Gaston; **Cezille**]

[Witnesses at the second marriage to Anne Lange were **Joseph Le Frugelais**; **Jacques Coquelin**; **François Touche**; **Mathurin Roger**]

Information on **Marie Daudain/Daudin**, daughter of Charles and Marie Guerin, was the wife of Antoine Michel Caron, former manager of the Company [of the Indies], deceased at Natchez. She married Pierre La Roche, son of Pierre and Marie Valin, native of Clermont in Auvergne, master carpenter, widower of Marie Alexis, deceased at Mobile, 5 July 1730 (in New Orléans?) [SLC. M1, 214]. [witnesses: Pasquier Bonnet; George Cappe; Nicolas Jean Caron; Antoine Edier; Jean Baptiste Leonard; **Charles Vincent**]

François Hupé [name given as Lupé, but was Hupé in Conrad] came on *le Philippe*, ship of the Compagnie d'Occident, 25 January 1719, to go to Louisiana. He was listed as a *habitant* on the Concession of Semonville and Canet and was from Paris. On the same ship were two soldiers named **Cezille**. On 1 July **1727** census of New Orleans he was enumerated as a **former sailor, with a wife and child**, on the street crossing behind Bourbon. In 1727 this street had no name but is now Dauphine Street. [Census, 89] In the 1731 map by Gonichon, Hupé was listed as a property owner. [Census, 112]

Catherine Chevalier, age 14 [no information on her found to date]

Jeanne Chevet, age 15, daughter of Jacques and Marie Grepine, native of Paris, married at Old Biloxi **Mathieu Avignon/Lavignon dit Provençal**, soldier in the naval regiment [do they mean la Marine?], **3 June 1721** [SLC, M1, 26, pp. 7, 51]. She was buried, age 22, 21 October 1725 [AN, F 1725, 36] [Mathieu Avignon was the son of Michel and Marthe??; witnesses: **Jacques Roba/Robot**; **Marie Barbe Lecomte**; **Alexandre Nicolas Capelle/Capel**; **Perette Vailly/Valiere**; **Norbert de Villeneuve**; **Marie Jeanne Francois**; **Sister St. Louis**]

In NO French, 88, their marriage is in a jumbled entry...de Mathieu Avignon fils de Michel Avignon and Marthe ?? married Jeanne Chevet, daughter of Jacques Chevet and Marie Grepine – 3 June 1721. No place specified.

[Conrad, II, p. 91] Jeanne Chevet was from the parish of St. Victor.

[Toups, p. 97 and Conrad, I, p. 107] **Mathieu Avignon**, a *jardinier* [gardener], and **Jacques Roba**, a *mannoeuvre* [workman], were aboard *la Seine*, 11 August 1720. On the concession of M. Le Blanc and Marquis Dasfeld. Also, **Jean Baptite Creilly**, a grape-grower.

Witnesses to marriage:

Jacques Roba and Marie Le Comte were married the same day as were **Alexandre Nicolas Capelle** and **Perette Vailly**; **Norbert de Villeneuve and Marie Jeanne François**.

Avignon was listed as a property owner in New Orleans in **1731** on the Gonichon map [Census, 110]. **1731** census in Ouma- **Avignon and one woman** [Census, 118]. In New Orleans **1732 Avignon** was

M1, 20] [He was the son of Pierre and Marie Forcier; witnesses: Larche; Andriot; St. Denis; F. Carrière; Barroy/Baroi; Giard; Tessier; Françoise Cecille; Loissel; J. Carrière; and Poitier] [The couple went to Kaskaskia.] [There was a Marie Collignon, wife of Joseph **Catoire**, age 30, resident of New Orleans, buried 14 September 1725 (AN, F 1725, 26)]

Leonard Billeron – son of Pierre Billeron and Marie Forciee [or Forcue], married **Marie Claire Catoire** – daughter of Pierre Catoire and Anne Potin, 23 April 1721. Place not specified. [NO French, 9]

Belting, pp. 88-89 “Veuve Lafatigue – **Marie Clarie Catois**, widow of Leonard Billeron *dit* Lafatigue, royal notary of Illinois from July 22, 1734, until his death in 1740, and one of the few widows of the Illinois who remained unmarried. Geneviève Desrost/Dero/Deroo, age 25 – daughter of Augustin and Marguerite Pipe, married at Old Biloxi, (1) **Albert Fondelay/Fondelis/Fundelich**, 4 February 1721 [SLC, M1, 10]; (2) **Jean Deroze**, 13 April 1733, in New Orleans ? [SLC, B1, 59] [Witnesses: Bouyer; **Sister Gertrude**] [Pipe is a name from the Ploemeur area.] [Albert Fondelay married (1) Marie Elisabeth Olerien, at Old Biloxi, 29 October 1720 (SLC, M1, 7); said to be a German soldier of the Company of Le Blanc.]

In the same census, but living on *rue de* Clairemont [now St. Philip Street] **Albert Fondeliek**, a German laborer, was enumerated with a wife and two children [Census, 94] [A strange thing: many of the same people are listed in both places and in the same census.] In the 1732 census of New Orleans the **widow Fondelay** was enumerated on rue St. Philippe, possibly living in the house of **Guidou/Guidon** who had a wife and two children [Census, 135]. In the **24 November 1721** census of New Orleans, **Julien Binard dit La Forge**, a blacksmith and **wife** were enumerated as being in the service of the Company [Census, 19]. In the **January 1726** census of the Colony of Louisiana **Julien Binard, smith, and wife** were enumerated on *rue* Royale [Census, 70]. In the **July 1727** census of New Orleans, **Julien Binard, master tailor, wife and child** were enumerated living on *rue* Royale [Census, 86].

In the list of landowners along the Mississippi after 1731 it was indicated that Rossard had some his property to Massy [Census, 145]. **Michel Rossard**, native of Blois, royal notary and chief registrar in the Province of Louisiana, widower of Margueritte Gilberte de la Gardette, deceased at **Paris**, married **Louise de Maranne dela Valtrie, 27 November 1730** [SLC, M1, 225]

F. Duval – François Duval, treasurer general of this Colony, former trustee of this parish, was buried **25 February 1729** [An, F1729, 94] [SLC, 95] Duval, auditor for the Company, was mentioned in a letter by Delachaise, **8 April 1723** [Census, 35]. Le sieur Duval was mentioned in a letter by Delachaise **18 October 1723** [Census, 37].

Catherine Barbe Du Bis/Duby/Barduby/Carduby, age 22, daughter of Jean Louis and Marie Roger, married (1) at Old Biloxi **Pierre François Doublin/Daublin, 2 June 1721** [SLC, M1, 26]; (2) **Jean Baptiste Chenier, 13 April 1722** [SLC, M1, 48] [Pierre François Daublin was the son of Gilles and Catherine Bouille/Bouillet; witnesses: **Nicolas Castagne, Gilles Pigeon; Louis Robillard;** Ferdinand Hubin; Valentin Joseph Daublin]. [Jean Baptiste Chenier, son of Jean Baptiste and Jeanne Descormier, from Montréal (There is no such couple. Possibly Jean Baptiste Chenier and Jeanne Arrivée whose stepfather was Michel Duvau *dit* Descormiers); witnesses: Louis Viger; **Jean**

Jean Baptiste Chenier – son of Jean Baptiste Chenier and Jeanne Descormier, married **Catherine Duby** – daughter of Jean Louis Duby and Marie Roger, widow of Pierre François Daublin, 13 April 1722. Place not specified. [NO French, 22]

[Toups, p. 106] **Jean François Daublin**, a laudreur ??, and his brother, from Monbellird, were on board *La Loire*, 11 August 1720, captian M. Desporte Hains.

Witnesses to marriage with **Daublin**:

Valentin Joseph Daublin was his brother; they were from Monbillard, Archdiocese of Cambrai. He married and had children in New Orleans.

Louis Robillard married **Marie Madeleine Cordier** [Baleine woman] at Old Biloxi **Louis Robillard, 15 May 1721** [SLC, M1, 25]. [Census, 58] **Robillard and wife**, listed as habitants of Illinois, 1 January 1726; [Census, 152] – **Robillard and wife**, listed 1 January 1732 in the prairie of Fort Chartres of Illinois.

Nicolas Castagne, Gilles Pigeon were also witness at the marriage of Louis Robillard and Marie Madeleine Cordier, 15 May 1721 at Old Biloxi [SLC, M1, 25]

Toussaint Loisel – possibly the son of Joseph Loisel and Jeanne Langlois, from Pointe-aux-Trembles. 11 January 1724 at Kaskaskia he married Cécile Brunet, daughter of Jean Brunet and Elizabeth Deshayes [Jetté, 740]

Not on list – Marie Jacqueline Dubos, daughter of René and Elizabeth Claire Valons, married at Old Biloxi **Barthelemy Scance, 8 July 1721** [SLC, M1, 37] [Barthelemy Scance was the son of Pierre

Philippe Rouet – son of Pierre Rouet and Suzanne Delisle, married **Anne Dumeny** – widow of Jean Piroque, daughter of Samuel Demier (?) and Marie Leonard, 7 August 1721. No place specified. [NO French, 91]

Thoinon Dumont, age 21 [no information on her found to date]

This marriage is not in New Orleans French.

Cezille – A soldier who was on *le Philippe*, ship of the Compagnie d'Occident, 25 January 1719, to go to Louisiana, as François Hupé [Lupé]. Also was a witness to marriage of **Marie Anne Charlotte/Charlote, Charlot**, at Old Biloxi, to **François Hupé**, of Paris, **16 June 1721** [SLC, M1, 31]

In the July 1727 of habitants along the Mississippi in the environs of New Orleans, **Jacques Charpentier**, occupying the habitation of le sieur St. Martin as director was enumerated. There appeared to be no wife [Census, 97].

Godparents for Philippe: Olivier Philippe, resident, and Jeane de Lafond, wife of [Pierre] Domail. Godparents of Catherine: Pierre Domail, resident, and **Catherine Pot** [Paul?] [Mobile, 273]

[Mobile, 124] Marie Jeanne de Prouan, daughter of Noel de Prouan and Louise Valde, was born 10 January 1722 and baptized 9 April 1722.

Rochon might be **Charles Rochon**. [Mobile, 58, 71, 86, 123,] Charles Rochon, son of Charles Rochon and Henriette Colon [*dite* Laviolette], was born 5 January **1716**. Pierre Rochon, son of **Charles Rochon** and Henriette Colon, was born 4 October **1717**. Marie Henriette Rochon, daughter of Charles Rochon and Henriette Colon, was born 17 February **1720**. Marie Joseph Rochon, daughter of Charles Rochon and Henriette Colon, was born 19 March 1722 and baptized 6 April **1722**. Henriette Colon dite Laviolette was the daughter of Jean Colon dit Laviolette and Catherine Exipakonoa, a Native American from Kaskaskia. Henriette was baptized there 27 November 1698. Henri de Tonty was her godfather.

Same couple? René Sabourdin married **Marie Clothilde Jouso** (Fouiot); son – Mathieu – baptized 23 April 1725; daughter, Marie Françoise – baptized 9 June 1726. [GCC, 59]

René Sabourin, son of René Sabourin and Catherine Delizier (?) married **Marie Catherine Foucault**, daughter of Jean Baptiste Foucault and Marie Françoise Nicole Defer, 22 March 1721, no place specified {NO French, 92}

[There was a René Sabourin, soldier, listed on the same boat as Philippe and Antoine Bienvenu in May 1718.]

Samuel Bernard called St. Cautin – son of Leon St. Cautin and Judith Baillard, married **Marie Genevieve Gernier** – daughter of Pierre Gernier and Marie Jeanne, 7 May 1721. Place not specified. [NO French, 9]

Catherine Gauzalau/Gonzalu, age 19, daughter of Jean Baptiste and Catherine Veillemain, married at Old Biloxi **Jean François Pomelle/Pomet, 7 May 1721** [SLC, M1, 24] [Jean François Pomelle was the son of Pierre and Marie Jeanne Chardru; witnesses: **Jean Bourbeau; Jacques Roba; Henry Riche**]
