THOMAS MAYES.

In the name of God Amen ...

I Thomas Mayes of South Carolina Union County - being weak of body but of perfit mind and memory Thanks be to almighty God, Calling to mind the mortality of the body and that It is appointed for all men once to Die Do make this my last will and Testament. First I bequath my Soul to almighty God Who gave it & my Body to be Buried in a christian Decent maner at the Discretion of my Executors not Doubing of a Generel resurrection, and as for What Goods or Worldly effects God hath been pleased, to bestow upon me I order & Dispose of in the following manner and form that is to say I order that all my Just dbts and funerel Chares be first paid out of the whole . - - - -

IMPRIMES I leave & bequath to my Son Thomas Mayes the whole of My Black smth tools Now in my Possession I order that my Son John Mayes Shall have twenty pounds Sterling to be paid out of my Plantation I also Order that My Son Edward Shall have my Plantation with the Crop Now upon it upon the Condition of his paying twenty pound Wm Sterling Unto my afore named Son John I also order that the Remainder of my Effects be equally Divided among the whole that is to Say Margaret Thomas John Edward Jane. and Elizabeth further I Constitue and appoint James Means Se<sup>r</sup><sub>d</sub> and my Son Thomas & Ew. the Executors of this my Last will & Testament made by me revokeing & disannuling all other wills and Testiments made By me and Cosidering this my Last will and Testament
